

Remarks on board of the Brig M
April 1869.

Friday 22.

Commences with fine weather & calm
sloop in sight employed & mending
the fore top gallant sail
at 2 P.M. toward the barboard boat
to pick up something adrift but it proved
to be grass. The Brig steering E.S.E. with a light
breeze from the W. & W. S.W. by aft.

Scatter part

fine weather & the wind from
the S. the Brig steering E.S.E. so ends this 24 hours
Lat. 30.12. N. Long 38.50. W.

Saturday 23.

Commences with fine weather
& a light breeze from the E.S.E. the Brig
steering E.S.E. with all sails out.

Scatter part

fine weather
& a light breeze from the E.S.E.
the Brig steering E.S.E. & sails on sight
brought to the W. & some porpoises so ends this 24 hours
Lat. 29.44. N. Long 38.51. W.

Sunday 24.

Commences with fine weather
& a light breeze from the E.S.E. the Brig
steering E.S.E. Scatter part.

fine weather
light changeable air one sail on sight & grampus
the Brig heading E.S.E. so ends this 24 hours.
Lat. 29.15. N. Long 38.15. W.

Voyaging on the South Atlantic Ocean
April 1869.

Monday 25.

Commences with squally weather
& light changeable air. The wind from E.S.E.
& the Brig heading from S.W. & S. by E.
and fore back & on sight at 2 P.M. the Brig heading
Scatter part

fine weather & a light breeze
from the S. the Brig steering E.S.E. one sail on sight
on sight so ends this 24 hours. Lat. 29.35. Long 38.37

Tuesday 26.

Commences with fine weather
& a light breeze from the S. the Brig heading
two sails on sight
Scatter part

much the same air
to the East of W. employed in breaking out
the true light from the S.S.E. so ends this 24 hours.
Lat. 30.03. W. Long 38.50.

Wednesday 27.

Commences with fine weather
& moderate breeze from the S.S.E.
the Brig heading East. two sails to the W. of W. this P.M.
two fore back & grampus employed in fitting
the main stay Scatter part.

Calm employed
in fitting the main sail two fore back & two sails
on sight this 24 hours. Lat. 30.03. Long 38.35
