Thursday October 1<sup>st</sup> 1874 Civil Account

At 10 Am I came on board at Clarke Point at 11.4 m the Pilot left me at the anchorage point with the wind N N W & baffling at 1 P m passed the vineyard Sound Light ship steered S by E until Friday at 12 m with a fresh breeze from W. to S. W. & ruggel when I found the Brig to be in

Lat 39° 44' N  
Long 68° 16' W

Saturday Oct 3<sup>rd</sup> Sea Account

Begins with fresh westerly wind & ruggel weather all hands employed getting boats ready for whaling steering S. by S. middle & latter part light winds & a heavy sea all square sail set steering S. E. so ends this day

Lat 39° 23' N  
Long 67° 00' W

Sunday Oct 4<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light northerly wind steering S. E. by E. with all drawing sail set - middle part wind hauled to N. latter part fresh breeze & cloudy weather Lat 38° 37' N Long 66° 00' W
