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Sunday July 12th 1885
The Lug Boat Nells took us in tow
from Hercules Wharf. Will Bedford
and towed us to the Saw and Rig
light ship from which we took our
departure at 4. P. M. with the wind
at East and light. For the middle
part of this day light wind from
N. N. E. to N. E. Light part the same
Staying S. W. by S.
Lat. 40.07 N. Long 71. 38. 77

Monday July 13th 1885
This day begins with moderate N. E.
wind and fine clear weather. For the
middle and latter part light wind blowing
from N. E. to S. E. Employed in various
ways. Staying S. by W. or W.

Lat 38. 39. N. Long 72. 12. 77

Tuesday July 14th 1885
The fore part of this day begins with
the wind at East veering to S. E.
For the middle part moderate S. E. wind
Latter part squally with wind veering
to the westward. By the wind on both
tacks. Several whales in sight
No. Obs.

Wednesday July 15th 1885
This day begins with squally weather
with wind at W. N. W. Spoke
the ship Blosser + Aurora.
For the middle and latter part light
winds and calm. Several sail in sight.
Employed in setting up the head
gear.
