

J Journal Kept by B Kirby to the South Seas on a Whaling Voyage

Remarks on Board July 22^d 1846 at 9 got under way with a fresh breeze from the south ends with a fresh breeze and rainey working ship out of the west passage

Thursday July 23^d 9 AM fresh breeze and rainey from the south at 1 left the Pilot comes in thick fogg saw a ship standing in bay who standing on the wind to the westward heading from S W by W to W S W at 8 tack'd ship to the southward at 11 AM tack'd to the westward thick fogg and a light breeze at 4 AM tack'd to S westward at 6 raining in torrents at 7 tack'd in main top of sail and tack'd to the westward and double reef'd the top sails at 10 the fogg lifted up Black Island W S W Dist 10 miles tack'd to the S W and set all sail latter fresh breeze and fine weather from S W several sails in sight
