Barque Fortunes Log Book Capt D. E. Hathaway

Sailed Oct 17th 1850 on a whaling voyage to S. E.

Remarks on Thursday Oct 17th
At 1 P.M. took the anchor & got under way with the wind
S.W. all hands aboard 29 all told beat down the bay at 5 P.M.
we came to inside dumplin light in fth of water passed
the sails set the watch so ends the beginning

Remarks on Friday Oct 18th
Went with strong winds from Southward and thick weather
at 9 A.M. got under way and tried to get out at noon came
to again off the Round hills laid until 5 P.M. ice dropped
down to outer roads and perfect the sail than it was
blowing strong weather looking bad at 7 P.M. boat came along
side and brought the Cadz anchor so ends

Remarks on Saturday Oct 19th
Began with heavy gale from South and thick rainy weather riding
with our anchor ahead at 5 A.M. gale increasing called all hands
dropped the second anchor at daylight wind shifted to Westward and
cleared up then we took our anchor and got under way stood to sea
several small vessels working out at noon we passed out by them

Remarks on Sunday Oct 20th
Went the sea lay with buffing winds from N.W. and beating out of
the bay number of our crews sea sick at 5 P.M. discharged Pilot
and took anchor on the bows and steered S by W wind
at 8 P.M. lost sight of light the boat bearing N.E. dist 4 miles at midnight
they South wind hauled to S.W. 5th hauled up S.E. latter steered the
anchors unhooked the chains & run them below so ends one sail sight
Lat by Oct 40:15 Long by Oct 70:41 West

Remarks on Monday Oct 21st
First part moderate gale from South and clear weather at S.E.
at 5 P.M. took in 3 fathom sail & double reefed 3d. sails hauled fore and
main sail Middle part strong gale & head squalls of rain had haul
latter clear weather men to fitting boats for whaling so ends men
recovering from sea sick Lat by Oct 69:24 Long by Oct 69:30 West

Remarks on Tuesday Oct 22nd
First part heavy gale from N.W. and cloudy weather the S.E. under double
reef 3d. sails with sea running Middle part it moderated some latter light
winds pleasant all hands employed being up rigging in whole doing very well

Remarks on Wednesday Oct 23rd Lat by Oct 68:37 Long by Oct 68:58
First part light breeze from West and pleasant sky S.E. all sail
set Middle and latter buffing winds steered by the wind heading
from S.W. to East Watch employed being up rigging Lat by Oct 67:58 Long by Oct 68:24
