Commences with moderate breeze from S.E. Steaming N.E. W.
With Studding Sails out and good weather Middle part strong
Breeze and squally latter part rainy and squalls wind from
S.E. to N.N.E. Bearing N.N.E. Wind fresh Lat 40° 00' 27-54
Long 080° 00' 08-24

Remarks for Tuesday May 9th

Commences with strong breeze from West & Steaming N.W.
With S.E. Sails out and squally with employed breaking
Out fore sail on a dash of water stow'd away some hanks
8pm wind N.N.E. heading N.E. tacked ship heading N.
On heading N.N.E. Middle and latter part much the same
Lat 40° 00' 28-59

Remarks for Wednesday May 10th

Commences with moderate breeze from N.E. by E. Steaming
By the wind heading N.N.E. a thick employ'd parting
And other small jobs about the ship Middle part much
The same latter part East set Studding Sails Steaming
N.N.E. wind employed parting Lat 40° 00' 30-82
Long 080° 00' 06-52

Remarks for Thursday May 11th

Commences with strong breeze from East & Steaming
N.N.E. with Studding Sails out with employed in
necessary ship's duty Middle part much the same
Latter part wind East Steaming N.N.E. Lat 40° 00' 32-32
Long 080° 00' 08-22

Remarks for Friday May 12th

Commences with moderate breeze from East & Steaming
N.N.E. with Studding Sails out with variously employed
Middle part wind S.E. latter part wind the same Steaming
N.N.E. with employed parting starboard Lat 40° 00' 34-16
Long 080° 00' 08-34

Remarks for Saturday May 13th

Commences with fresh breeze from S.E. Steaming S.E. W.
With Studding Sails out and good weather with variously
employed Middle part wind haul'd to East latter
part much the same two sail in sight Lat 40° 00' 36-13
Long 080° 00' 13-07

Remarks for Sunday May 14th

Commences with strong breeze from East & Steaming N.E.
With Studding Sails out and frequent rain squalls with
Employ'd in ship's duty Middle part wind Wind S.E. latter
part much the same Steaming N.E. thick heavy weather
Lat 40° 00' 38-48
Long 080° 00' 11-87

Remarks for Monday May 15th

Commences with strong breeze from S.E. Steaming N.E. with
Studding Sails out and thick foggy weather Middle part
Heavy rain squalls with thunder and lightning took in Studding Sails
Latter part thick fog thrown the try works overboard & am
Sound'd in 22 fathoms water I am clean'd up now Long Island
bearing N. several sails in sight set Studding sails and kept off
N.E. I am thick fog again Steaming S.E. by light house from South
And West & sound'd in 20 fathoms

Remarks for Tuesday May 16th

Commences with light breeze from South East & Steaming
S.E. thick foggy weather 8pm sound'd and got 20 fathoms
got the gun up and fired for a Pilot 7pm took in Studding
Sails, Top, Upp, Sails and double reef'd the J. Sails buffer'd to the
Wind Starb'ard took above Middle part thick fog latter part
thick foggy weather I am clean'd up now took light bearing
N.E. Distance 12 miles light buffeting wind Steaming S.E.
Several sails in sight

Remarks for Wednesday May 17th

Commences with light buffeting winds from all points Steaming
S.E. saw Black Island Light Bearing N.E. Middle part
thick fog latter part discharge'd the gun for a Pilot
6am took ship heading S.E. I took her heading
N.E. 10 am took a Pilot or board man call'd hands
and got up the chains and anchors of the boat
thick fog sound'd several times 20 and 21 fathoms
water 12 am took ship heading S. and S.E. 8
