A few remarks on the whaling voyage from the  
Sandwich Islands towards the coast of Japan

Friday April 18 1823 weighed the anchor and steered  
to the S.W. nothing remarkable occurred until the 3<sup>rd</sup> of  
May when we saw Walker Island bearing W by N 15 miles  
Distance stood in for the land and sent the boats on  
shore for wood at noon the boats returned with wood  
and fish found the Lat<sup>th</sup> 19 23 N Long 166 48 30 W

The 4<sup>th</sup> employed in getting wood and a great quantity of  
bread was made on shore the 5<sup>th</sup> at 4 o'clock started  
to the S.W. Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> saw 2 long sperm Whales going  
to the Southward saw nothing more remarkable until  
the 17<sup>th</sup> of May when we saw 2 long Whales and got out

Lat 25 20 N Long 166 20 E  
May the 21<sup>st</sup> got two long Whales in Lat 28 40 Long 162

Sunday May 26 saw Whales in Lat 28 50

Saturday May 31 saw Whales in Lat 28 09 N Long 161 54 E

Sunday June 1 spoke the ships Orion & Atlantic both  
Whaling ships June the 3<sup>rd</sup> saw 2 long Whales Lat 28 23

Long 158 East June the 5<sup>th</sup> Lat 28 00 Long 157 00  
saw Whales going quick to the S.E.

June the 6<sup>th</sup> saw 2 ahead of us when we got one long Whale  
and a small one in Lat 27 37

Monday June the 7<sup>th</sup> saw  
9 long whales and got it Lat 27 00

Wednesday June the 11<sup>th</sup> spoke the Atlantic and Orion  
in Lat 27 55 Long 162 50 East

Friday 12<sup>th</sup> saw Whales in Lat 27 50 Long 159 30 E  
got 4 in 40 min each

June 14<sup>th</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> saw 2 Whales got one it was  
very supped and rapidly
