the same, saw a Pintack.

Dec. 6th

Moderate from N.W. steering
the same.

Dec. 7th

Light breezes from the North,
steering S.S.E.

Dec. 8th

Calms about all day,
variously employed in ship's duty

Lat. 23.44 Long 116.12

Dec. 9th

Calms and rain squalls all day.

Dec. 10th

Calms and light airs from the
S.E. steering S.E. when possible

Dec. 11th

Moderate from N.E. steering
S.E. under easy sail, variously
employed in ship's duty.

Dec. 12th

Strong N.E. trades steering S.E.

Lat. 19.18 Long 113.33

Dec. 13

Moderate N.E. trades at daylight
saw the Island of St. Rosa or
Clanion Island at 12 noon went
ashore with two boats and
caught some fish.

Light N.E. trades, steering E.S.E.

topmast staysail and bent them.
Took Frank Morgan one of the
Boatswains and put him forward
for the reason that he doesn't
know anything at all. Took James
Moria and put in his place.

Moderate N.E. trades steering
by the wind on the Port Tack
employed repairing the sails.

Dec. 17th

The same as the preceding
winty four hours, and steering same

Dec. 18th

Strong N.E. trades steering the
same.

Dec. 19th

Strong trades steering S.S.E.

Strong trades steering S.S.E.
variously employed
