

Ship Franklin in the North Atlantic

12th In the first watch the Starboard watch set the Main Top Gallant Sail in the middle watch the Starboard watch furled the the Main Top Gallant sail clewed down the Topsails and let them hang until eight bells then all hands doubled reefed the Fore and Main and singled reefed the Mizzen Topsails This morning the Starboard watch set the Main Sail then employed in breaking out the Main hold Ship steering E. N. E.

13th The wind has lulled This morning the Starboard Watch shook the reefs out of the Top Sails set the Top Gallant sails and Flying Jib all hands employed in setting up the rigging Raised a Sail standing to the N. E. Ship steering N. E. & N.

14th In the middle watch the Starboard Watch furled the Fore and Mizzen Top Gallant Sails and Flying Jib made all sail this morning all hands employed in setting up the rigging Spoke the B. Barb Isles at 5 o'clock pm from Liverpool bound to Alexandria & C. Raised a Small of Black Fish at 6 o'clock pm course

15th In the first watch the Starboard Watch furled the Top Gallant sails and Flying Jib in the morning watch made sail then employed in working on the rigging course E. N. E.

16th In the second watch raised a Sail steering N. W. in the morning the Starboard watch furled the Fore and Mizzen Top Gallant Sails in the Am watch the Starboard Watch took in the Main Top Gallant sail Jib double reefed the Top Sails furled the Main Sail and set the Main Spencer Raised Jib backs Ship steering E. N. E.

17th In the middle watch the Starboard Watch furled the Fore and Mizzen Top Gallant Sails The Starboard Watch set the Jib and Main sail we run past several Fishing smacks which lay riding at anchor Saw the Ship Camp

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of St Johns we showed our Longitude in the day watch we furled the Main Sail and Jib double reefed the Top Sails then employed in breaking out Ship steering

18th This morning we squared the yards and run before the wind this day being Sunday we have not had any thing to do but to work Ship Raised Blackfish but did chas them before

19th Last night the weather was squally we were under double reef topsails all night this morning the starboard watch shook the reefs out of the topsails we set the Jib and Main sail the men at the Masthead raised a sail about 4 o'clock Am in the day we furled the Mainsail and Jib and double reefed the ^{topsails} E. N. E.

20th This morning the Starboard watch shook the reefs out of the topsails set the Top Gallant and Jib Mainsail flying Jib raised a sail about 2 points abaft the weather beam ^{at 10} in in the morning all hands shortened sail Course E. N. E.

21st The Starboard watch pulled up the courses this morning we set the courses ~~then~~ Raised a sail this fore noon standing along on the Starboard tack then employed in breaking out Ship steering E. N. E.

22nd This morning the Starboard watch set the Flying Jib Main and Mizzen Top Gallant Sails the second mate Raised a Small of Black Fish at 9 o'clock Am on the Starboard quarter got the Boats and loward away but did not get past Saw them again about noon loward away but
