Remarks On Board Sept 29 1857

At 6 A.M. with all hands On Board
took our anchor and stowed a warm the bay
at 8 1/2 o'clock discharged the pilot and
steered S.W. by all hands employed steering
the anchors and chains at 11 1/2 hours
Saw a S. E. 15 miles so ends this 24
hour

Remarks On Board Wednesday Sept 30 1857

First part this 24 hours strong breeze from N.W.
to course S.W. by compass employed in getting
everything snug for the night at 9 P.M. Chase
watched and steered S.W. by compass middle
part with S.W. to S.E. and squally with rain
 Latter part pleasant all hands employed
in ship duty saw a dark Bounce to W.
so ends this 24 hour

Remarks On Board Thursday Oct 1 1857

First part this 24 hour fresh breeze from N.W. to
to S. steering S.W. by G. at 4 P.M. Employed
in ship duty middle part pleasant with wind
from S.W. latter part with sun S. with fine
weather all hands employed in fitting boats
and other work about deck so ends this
24 hour
