

Ship George From New Bedford

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Sunday June 19th 1836

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Commences with strong winds lying to, at 11 am sent down topgallant yards at 1/2 past 11 lost waist-boat from the cranes cleared up decks at 1 pm the starboard water below at day light set fore sail and fore top sail shook out the reefs &c at 7 the watch below the larboard watch fitting topgallant yards and sending them aloft at 8 so ends this day moderate with a heavy swell Steering E by S  
Lat 39.20 Lon 46.58

Monday June 20 1836

Commences with light winds sent the fore & mizen topgallant yards aloft at 8 am lying to wind or close reef main top sail at 8 AM shook out one reef from fore and main top sail mizen top sail in. so ends this day with strong breezes from West Steering S E.  
Lon by chro 43.5 (37) 51

Tuesday June 21:

17 days out  
Commences with light winds all hands employed in Ship's duty fitting waist boat &c at 1/2 am steered E by S all hands continued &c so ends this day Good weather  
Lat by Obs 38.47 Lon 41.5 by Obs by Chro 40.

Wednesday June 22

Commences with pleasant weather all hands employed in Ship's duty fitting waist boat &c pleasant weather &c at 8 AM rigged blacksmiths forge employed in duty &c so ends this day Good weather Steering E by S.  
Lat Low

Thursday June 23

Commences with light winds & heavy swell all hands employed &c at 3 pm a sail broke out the main hatch way &c at 11 pm steering E with topgallant sails out at 7 am all hands employed in Ship's duty at 5 am sailing all hands employed Steering E by S Lat by Obs 40 Lon by chro 37.30

Friday June 24

Commences with fine winds all hands employed fitting ship at 7 pm took in mainsail fore & mizen topgallant sail furlled this &c at 1/2 past 2 took in main topgallant
