Saturday June 25<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong breezes from N.W. the watch  
employed in ships duty at 6 double reefed the main  
topsail at 4 the watch employed in duty with thick hazy  
weather. So ends this day steering S.E. with double reefed  
topsails Lat Lon 21 days out

Sunday June 26<sup>th</sup>

Commences with thick hazy weather the watch emp.  
loyed in duty at 1<sup>st</sup> past one set the Sib & mainsail  
steering S.E. at 4 P.M. made the Island of Corvo  
bearing South distant 15 miles, took in Sib & main  
sail. Close reefed the topsails. at 6 wore ship head  
ing N.N.E. Corvo bearing S by W. distant 15 miles at  
7 the watch below middle part ricing latter part  
clear and and cold at 8 took out the reefs set the  
main top gallant sail Sib & fly Sib at 9 P.M. wore ship  
and steered S.E. by E. A sail in sight on the weather  
quarter Stanamy S.E. Flores & Corvo in sight so ends the  
day good weather steering S.E. by E. 22 days out  
Lat by Obs 39<sup>o</sup> 42<sup>o</sup> Long by Chro 50<sup>o</sup> 28

Monday June 27<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fine breezes from N.E. saw  
a finback steering S.E. by E. at 6 P.M. took in sail and  
set the watch quarter watches middle and latter part  
fine weather and calm. at 7 A.M. the quarter watch below  
saw a school of black fish at 1 P.M. all hands employed  
saw a finback fine weather from N.E. standing  
to N.W. at 7 took in sail so ends this day  
fine weather Lat 39<sup>o</sup> 42<sup>o</sup> Lon 50<sup>o</sup> 28 23 days out

Tuesday June 28<sup>th</sup>

Commences with light winds and calm saw a fin  
back all hands employed in ships duty at 7 P.M.  
took in top gallant sails double reefed the top  
sails the watch below standing to the northward

Cruising off the Azores, or Western Islands  
Saw three 24 hours clear cold and rugged  
Lat by Obs 39<sup>o</sup> 15<sup>o</sup> Long by Chro 29<sup>o</sup> 40  
Wednesday July 1<sup>st</sup>

Commences with fine weather, the Islands of L'ris  
Fagal & St. George in sight steering South East at  
7 Standing under whole fore and main topsail double reefed  
mizen steering by the wind, middle part pleasant at 6 am  
tacked ship, but would not head & e breaking out the  
run & e at 1<sup>st</sup> past 9 am made the island of Terceira  
bearing S.S.W. so ends this day fine weather  
Lat by Obs 39<sup>o</sup> 15<sup>o</sup> Lon 25 days out  
Thursday July 30<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fine weather & light breezes saw  
a small schooner, all hands employed & e at 7 P.M.  
took in mainsail, fly Sib and main top gallant sail  
passed Terceira at 8 P.M. double reefed the mizen topsail  
at 9 tacked ship and stood in for the land fine weather  
and strong breezes from W.S.W. steered South by West  
at 7 am set main sail, top gallant sail, and took out the  
reefs from mizen topsail so ends this day fine weather steering  
for the land, cruising Lat 39<sup>o</sup> 6 Lon 26 days out  
Friday July 31<sup>st</sup>

Commences with fine breezes and pleasant weather all  
hands employed in fitting rigging & e at 1 P.M. in mainsail  
saw a sail standing to the northward and eastward wore ship  
at 7 P.M. the watch below at 9 double reefed the topsails  
at 1 P.M. wore ship heading N.W. fine weather at 7 am  
a sail in sight hazy the watch below saw a finback  
middle fine latter hazy so ends fine weather, 28 days out  
Lat by Obs 38<sup>o</sup> 54<sup>o</sup>

Saturday July 2<sup>nd</sup>

Commences with fine weather, saw a ship to leeward  
saw a spoke her, the Barge <sup>speculation</sup> of Lisbon & wore  
out the rib, St George Fagal & Terceira in sight  
middle part fine topsail in sight so ends this day  
fine weather
