Signal of a Whaling Voyage of the
Ship Alfred Gibbs to the Pacific Ocean

Wednesday Nov 2nd 1859

At 5 1/2 A.M. took our anchors and sailed
from the port of New Bedford on a
Whaling Voyage to the Pacific Ocean Capt
E Nichols Master, the winds light and
b. baffling from the westward at noon
I found tide bore N. by E. tis 3 miles
One crew consisting of thirty one men
one Boatsteerer short

1 day out Nov 3rd

Begins with light and baffling winds
from the Westward at 4 P.M. the
Pilot took his leave 4 1/2 our Anchors
securely lashed and chains stowed
At 5 chose Boats crews and watches
No man's land bearing E by S dist 7 miles
At 3 1/2 took a heavy Squall from the North
took in Top Gallant Sails and closed down
Top Sails at 4 1/2 set the Top sails and Abain
Top Gallant Sail

2 days out Friday Nov 4th

Begins with strong winds from the N.W.
Course S E under whole topsails latter part
Moderate

3 days out Saturday Nov 5th

Begins with light air from the westward
Course South E by E employed in fitting Boats
Latter part fresh breeze from N.W.
