5 days out

Monday Nov 7th

Begins with Strong winds from the W^{NW}
Course S. E. by E latter Squally At 1 A M
Wind hauled to the Northward and a
Squall accompanied with Thunders & lightning
Shastend Sail

6 days out

Tuesday Nov 8th

Begins with Strong winds from the North
latter part the same saw a Bark Steering
Westward

7 days out

Wednesday Nov 9th

Strong winds from the N^W Steering
S. E. by E At 10 P M took in the Main
Sail & Main Top Gallant Sail

8 days out

Thursday Nov 10th

Begins with Strong Winds & squally
Course S. E. by E latter part more moderate
All Sail set the Wind N. E.

9 days out

Friday Nov 11th

Begins with light airs from the N. E.
Steering by the wind to the S. E.
Took up the Main Top Gallant latter part
Winds from the Southward Steering by the
Wind to South East middle & latter part light
Winds from the Southward Steering to the

Sater day Nov 12

Begins with light Winds from the
S^W Steering to the Eastward At 6 A M

& latter part fine with light winds from
The Southward all hands employ'd in
Ships duty So ends this day

11 days out

Sunday Nov 13th

Begins with light Winds from the South
West Steering S. E. by E with all Sail set
At one P M spoke the Norwegian Brig
Arancee from Norway bound to Macanua
Middle & latter part light winds from
the Northward Steering S. E. nothing more
Of any importance

12 days out

Monday Nov 14

Begins with light winds from the
Northward Steering South East with all
Sail set Middle part heavy squalls
From the N. E. took in Top Gallant Sails
& dilled reefed the Topsails at 10 A M
Passed a Ship to the windward Steering
to the Westward latter part the weather
the same Steering S. E.

13 days out

Tuesday Nov 15th

Begins with strong winds from the N. E.
And a heavy swell attended Steering
S. E. by E under double reefed Topsails
