

Remarks on board in the harbor of Tombes  
Tuesday Sept 12 1860

Still at anchor fine weather, employed in  
getting of recruited & variously employed others  
all hands sick with colds the old hog on shore  
317 days out

Thursday 13<sup>th</sup>  
Still at anchor fine weather employed  
in getting water & washing ship the capt<sup>n</sup> on  
board trading & P.M. the capt<sup>n</sup> & Mate  
Went on shore and stoned all night  
318 days out

Friday 14<sup>th</sup>  
Begin fine weather & P.M. the Capt<sup>n</sup> & mate  
came on board took our anchors and left the  
harbor of Tombes for Patia in com<sup>d</sup> with  
3 ships

Saturday 15<sup>th</sup>  
319 day  
Fine weather moderate breezes working up  
the coast by short tacks & P.M. Cape Blanco  
here I & 13 miles dist  
320

Sunday 16<sup>th</sup>  
Strong Breezy standing off shore 17 A.M.  
Tacked in shore to Cape Blanco bearing  
I & 12 miles dist tacked off shore under  
topails & courses blowing strong one ship  
in sight to the leeward  
321 day out

Monday 17<sup>th</sup>  
Moderate breezes working up the coast  
By short tacks in company with the Louisa  
of New Bedford 6 P.M. the harbor of Patia  
bearing I & 20 miles dist

Remarks on board in the harbor of Patia Sept 1860  
Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup>

Fine weather & P.M. came to anchor in the  
harbor of Patia sent down the Main royal  
& topgallant yards the capt<sup>n</sup> on shore

Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup>  
Still at anchor fine weather all hands employed  
in sending down the Main Topmast & gallant  
mast and made new trussle trees no letters from  
home homesick as I do, cold taced the bends  
324

Thursday 20<sup>th</sup>  
Still at anchor all hands employed in  
Painting ship & sending up the new trussle trees  
the old hog on shore hard days work done today  
325

Friday 21<sup>st</sup>  
Still at anchor fine weather the Starboard  
watch ashore on liberty the Larboard watch  
employed in getting rigging & painting ship  
326 days

Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Still at anchor fine weather the Larboard  
watch on shore the Starboard watch employed in  
filling & painting ship the Longacre coming off &  
On Capt Swift & wife came alongside but did  
not come on board get a bad cold & cough  
327 day

Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Still at anchor fine weather the watch ashore  
on liberty 3 ships laying off & on the Longacre  
Alto & Peru of Antucket bound to Tombes  
328 days out

Monday 24<sup>th</sup>  
Still at anchor the watch on shore on liberty  
employed in painting ship 8 men missing conches  
lay of discontent  
329 day
