on Board  
Saturday August the 4<sup>th</sup>

All these 24 hours moderate breeze and  
favourable; then at 11 AM the ship  
all sail out to the West where they sail  
Lat by the 19.22 4.40

Remarks on  
Board Sunday  
August the 5<sup>th</sup>

first part strong breeze from N.E. and  
heavy steam S.W. all sail out in the fore part  
moderate at mid night have the at 4 AM  
wind the land breeze of 10 miles. First  
at 4 AM strong wind steam S.W. is proved  
to be the end of the steamer and then  
the 2nd part steam at E 4 miles. First  
breeze to sail in the 20 miles.

Remarks on  
Board Monday  
August the 6<sup>th</sup>

first part moderate breeze from N.E.  
and heavy steam S.W. at sunset the island  
of St. Antonio seen at 18 miles. First  
at 9 AM a breeze from the N.W. all sail out  
steams to the S.W. latter part wind back  
to the E and heavy weather no sail in  
the 20 miles. No observation.

Remarks on  
Board Tuesday  
August the 7<sup>th</sup>

first part moderate breeze from S.W.  
and heavy steam S.E. all sail out in the middle  
part strong breeze and pleasant at 4 AM  
saw the island of Fogo Airy 8.5  
miles. First at 4 AM a breeze from the N.W.  
afterwards the ship sailing of the 20 miles  
in the 20 miles.

August the 8<sup>th</sup>

first part strong breeze from the N.W.  
and heavy steam S.W. all sail out in the middle  
part moderate breeze from the N.E. and heavy  
steam S.W. the ship at 11 AM the 10 miles  
of Fogo seen at 18 miles. First  
at 11 AM the 20 miles.

first part moderate breeze from S.W.  
and heavy steam S.W. all sail out in the middle  
part strong breeze from the N.W. and heavy  
steam S.W. the ship at 11 AM the 10 miles  
of Fogo seen at 18 miles. First  
at 11 AM the 20 miles.

August the 10<sup>th</sup>

Concours with strong breeze from N.W.  
and frequent squalls of rain all sail out to the  
West where they sail S.W. Wind S.W. and  
latter part strong breeze and squalls of rain  
and took in sail as before required in the 20  
miles. Lat by the 19.22 4.40
