

Schooner Glacier Log ⁴⁷
Bound on a Whaling Voyage to
Hudson Bay. George H. Tubbs Master

Tuesday June
21st 1864

Brisk breeze from N.E. & fair weather at 12 A.M.
got underway & stood out the bay

Wednesday June 22nd

Commenced with a moderate breeze from N.E.
& pleasant weather steering S.W. at 2 P.M.
The pilot left & we proceeded on the voyage at
7 P.M. steering S.E. Middle part light
breeze steering S.E. Later part steering E. &
S. Light breeze from the westward of Number
Vasick employed fixing boats & Antucket
bearing N.E. Distance about 25 miles &
Number of sails on sight so ends this day
Lat 40.18' N.

Thursday June 23rd

Commenced
with a light breeze from S.W. & pleasant
weather steering S.E. land out of sight all
hands employed fixing boats middle part brisk
breeze & foggy steering S.E. by S. Later part S. strong
breeze from W. & hard weather double reefed
the mainsail & took in flying jib so ends

Friday June 24th

This day come in
with a strong breeze from W. & haze weather
steering S.E. under easy sail all hands
employed fixing boats & other jobs the Coho
Leaking 4 inches of water in 9 hours at 2 P.M.
Moderate squalls & later part light
breeze from N.W. so ends this day
