

Schr Glacier Log. Bound to  
Saturday June 25<sup>th</sup> 1864

These 24 hours commences with  
light breeze from N.W. & pleasant weather steering  
E. with all sail set one sail passed bound N.  
all hands variously employed at 7 p.m. spoke  
Schr House Field bound to New York middle  
part light breeze from N.W. & later part  
wind N.W. steering E. by E. No ends this day  
Lat 43<sup>33</sup> Long 62.04 W.

Sunday June 26<sup>th</sup>  
Moderate breeze from N.W.  
A foggy weather steering E. S. E. A bark  
passed steering to N.E. the watch employed  
at different jobs middle part light breeze  
A heavy swell took in mainsail on account  
of Schr rolling. Later part light breeze from  
E. E. & thick fog set the mainsail reefed so end

Monday June 27<sup>th</sup>  
commenced with  
light breeze from E. E. & thick fog steering E. S. E.  
middle & later part light breeze from N.W. & fog  
the watch variously employed the Schr leaking  
the same so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday June 28<sup>th</sup>  
This day some in with  
A moderate breeze from N.W. & thick fog steering  
E. S. E. with all sail set middle part raining &  
squally with rain & thunder & lightning at 1  
o'clock. A. M. struck the foremast did no  
damage took in mainsail & jib at 11.  
A. M. passed A small iceberg & variable  
weather. A large swell from Westward.  
No ends this day

Hudson Bay  
Wednesday June 30<sup>th</sup> 1864

Commences with  
moderate breeze from N.W. & variable weather  
steering E. by E. under easy sail on account of  
schr rolling the watch variously employed at  
middle part light breeze & cloudy later part  
the same made all sail so ends this day

Thursday June 30<sup>th</sup>  
commences with A  
light breeze from N.W. & cloudy weather  
steering E. S. E. & N. E. by E. four sails in light  
hoisted the masthead the watch employed at  
different jobs Frank Boudette off duty sick  
middle part light air from N.W. & rain & heavy  
later part light breeze from E. S. E. & thick fog  
at 11 A. M. tacked heading to the N.E. so ends  
No ends

Friday July 1<sup>st</sup>  
these 24 hours commences  
with A moderate breeze from N.W. & thick  
fog steering E. by E. the watch employed at different  
jobs at 6 p.m. double reefed mainsail middle part  
thick fog later part the same steering E. by E. & ends  
No ends

Saturday July 2<sup>nd</sup> 1864  
commences with  
A light breeze from N.W. & thick fog steering E. under  
easy sail Frank Boudette on duty again well. The  
watch employed at different jobs middle part  
foggy later part the same steering N.E. employed  
breaking out. No ends these 24 hours No ends

Sunday July 3<sup>rd</sup>  
commences  
with A light breeze from E. S. E. & thick fog  
steering N.E. under easy sail middle part middle  
cloudy & rainy later part foggy so ends this day
