

Remarks on Board Bark Globe. 1858.

Sunday Aug 29th Commences with a fresh breeze from the N.E. with squally rainy weather. heading by the wind to the Eastward. at 5 P.M. took in the light sail & double reefed the topsails. Middle part equally. latter part fresh breeze at daylight. made all sail at 11 A.M. Double reefed again heading to the Eastward

Monday Aug 30th Commences with a fresh breeze from the N.E. with equally weather. heading by the wind to the Eastward. saw Grampuses the Capt. killed one with a lance but he sunk. Middle part wind & weather the same. latter part at 8 A.M. saw a school of sperm whales. at 9 lowered the Boats

Tuesday Aug 31st Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with pleasant weather the boats off after whales struck & got two. at 3 P.M. took them to the ship & cut them in. Middle part employed cutting up blubber. latter part employed clearing away the heads. at 11 A.M. commenced boiling.

Wednesday Sept 1st Commences with a light breeze from N.E. to S.W. steering by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. Double reefed the topsails. saw Blackfish. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze & pleasant. employed boiling. at 11 A.M. finished. saw a sail

Thursday Sept 2nd Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. with pleasant weather. heading by the wind N.E. saw a schooner. Middle & latter parts light breeze & pleasant. repaired the old fore topgallant sail & bent it. employed washing ship & cooping oil. saw 5 sails.

Friday Sept 3rd Commences with a light breeze from the S.W. with pleasant weather. heading to the S.E. spoke the schooner Walter Irving of Provincetown with 120 sp. & 120 tumpback oil. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze & pleasant. steering S.E. six sail in sight.

Saturday Sept 4th Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.W. with pleasant weather. steering to the S.E. employed setting up rigging. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze from the Westward. steering S.E. saw two sail. all hands employed setting up rigging.

Sunday Sept 5th Commences with a moderate breeze from the Westward. with pleasant weather. steering S.E. Middle part the same. latter part fresh breeze from N.W. with passing squalls. steering S.E. & S. saw a sail

Monday Sept 6th Commences with a fresh breeze from N.W. to East with squally weather. steering S.E. by S. at 7 P.M. Double reefed the topsails. Middle part the same. latter part fresh breeze from N.E. with cloudy weather. steering S.E. by S. saw three sail.

Tuesday Sept 7th Commences with a fresh breeze from the N.E. with cloudy weather steering S.E. Middle & latter parts light air from the North. with a heavy swell. saw Grampuses & a sail. employed at ships duty
