Remarks on board B K Globe June 10<sup>th</sup> 1862  
June 10<sup>th</sup> Began on a whaling voyage to the Atlantic  
Ocean this day Commenced with moderate breeze  
and fine weather at 11 A.M. took our anchor and  
worked out the day with the wind from south  
to S.W. so ends the day

Wednesday June 11 this day Commenced with moderate  
breeze from the south and pleasant weather  
ship working out the day at 6 P.M. the Pilot  
left the ship middle part fresh breeze from the  
S & S.W. smoky land south latter part  
moderate breeze from W & S.W. Course S by E 185  
saw a steam ship so ends the day lat 40.50 North  
long 70.54 West

Thursday June 12 this day Commenced with moderate  
breeze from the S.W. and fair weather middle  
part fresh breeze from the S.W. with some  
rain at 11 P.M. doubled reef the Top sails ship  
heading to the southward and eastward latter  
part strong breeze from W & S.W. ship  
heading S by E the watch employed fitting  
boats so ends the day lat 39.40 North  
long 69.20 West

Friday June 13 this day Commenced with strong  
breeze from S.W. and hazy ship heading S & E  
the watch employed fitting boats middle part  
the same latter part fresh breeze from W & S.W.  
and fine weather Course S by E the watch  
employed fitting boats so ends the day  
lat 36.40 North  
long 67.15 West
