Remarks Thursday June 28th 1865
1st Day

First part fresh breeze from S.W. at 1 1/2 P.M. took our anchors and sailed from the Port of New Bedford bound on a Whaling Voyage to the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans.

Middle part - blowing hard with heavy rain and thunder & lightning. Latter part - wind S.W. at 11 A.M. cleared off. Made sail. All sick, and some drunk. Saw several sails. So once heading by the wind to S.W.

Remarks Wednesday June 29th 2nd Day

First part fresh breeze from S.W. Steering by to the S.W. Employed stowing anchors and chains and getting boats for whaling. Chose 8 boats - crews and watches. Oh! never was so ill sick before. My little dog is to I think. he sticks to me like a brother. He is a great care, for he cannot go up or down stairs alone. He knows round some. But cannot find heart to whip him yet. Latter part moderate and fair saw Killers. Lat 39-30 Long 70-19

Remarks Thursday June 29th 3rd

First part moderate breeze from S.W. heading by to the S.W. saw Killers and Porpoises. Employed getting boats. Latter part light air from the S.W. heading S.E. saw Black Bird. and several sails heading to the Eastward

Lat 38-57 Long 69-47
