Ship Grand Turk July the 16th 1736

Sunday July the 16th
 These 24 hours Commences with fine
 breeze from the N.W. and fair weather
 Ship under all sail for from the wind
 Crew Employed on Ships Duty
 Middle Part Continued the same
 Latter Part Endeavour, Breeze, and
 Sultry So Ends
 Lat by obs 26° 57'
 Long by obs 26° 16'

Monday July the 17th
 These 24 hours Come with light winds and
 Pleasant weather Nothing in sight
 Middle Part Calm at 11 AM fine Breeze from
 the North at 6 AM saw Sails of Black fish
 found three Boats did not stick at 7 AM
 Came on Board took up the boats and
 Square away Latter Part Endeavour light
 breeze and fair weather Lat 25° 50'
 So Ends these 24 hours Longitude 23° 50'

Tuesday July the 18th
 These 24 hours Commences with light breeze
 and Pleasant weather Ship under all sail
 for from the wind all hands Employed
 on Ships Duty Middle Part light Breeze
 at 10 AM saw a small boat to be
 a sperm found the boats but saw her no
 more So Ends these 24 hours
 Lat by obs 26° 11' Longitude 23° 26' W

Wednesday July the 19th
 These 24 hours Commences with fine
 breeze and Pleasant weather Ship under
 all sail at 3.30 P.M. saw a sperm whale
 found a small boat to be a sperm
 Latter Part strong breeze and thick
 weather Nothing in sight
 So Ends these 24 hours
 Lat by obs 26° 36' W
 Longitude 23° 51' W
