Remarks on Board Ship *Emetivik*
from New Bedford to the Coast of Baffin

At 11 AM got under way at Clark's point
and put to sea with a fresh breeze from the S that
this ends this 24 hours Wednesday April 28th 1841

Remarks on Board Thursday April 29th day 1841
At 4 PM discharging the pilot steering to the S S E
At 5 PM mammals land bearing N N E at 24 miles at sea
set double reef the topsails at 7 PM in a strong
breeze from W by S to W S the steering is the
min' ship heading about S at day in 1 mile all
sails all hands in play in getting the boat for
whaling 2 sails in sight to the S E

Lat 40.23 North Long 70.25 West
Remarks Friday April 30th day 1841
first part of this 24 hours light breeze from the
South steering to the S and W all hands in play
filling the boats at 4 PM commences raining in
PM wind hal S E double reef the top sails
took in jib and m sails at 10 had heavy squalls from
S E hauled fore and on topsails and close reef the
m topsails at 3 PM wind got round N West and
blew a gale more ship and ran to the South so ends

Lat 39.29 North
Remarks Saturday May 1st day 1841
the gale still continues at 2 PM moderate but
fore and m's topsails and jib at day light set at a top
sawyer steering to the West saw nothing more all hands
in play getting boats for whaling so ends this 24 hours

Lat 38.56 North Long 70.32 West
Sunday May 2nd The first part of this 24 hours strong breeze
and squally at 4 PM hauled jib and reef the topsails at 6
more ship to North at 6 PM set jib and fore topsails
saw several sails to the South so ends this 24 hours
Lat 38.39 North Longitude 69.51 West
