 Wadly to-day he did not think he could help her.
 May 27th I went to meeting this forenoon to the Grace
 Church, and this afternoon I went to the Grave Yard with
 Eliza O'Connell, it rained in the evening so I stand at home.
 May 28th Uncle Samuel has gone to work to-day, Mary
 & me went to the office to carry Memorias little & I
 lost a quarter of a dollar, we went back but we
 could not find it. Then I went to Mary & Mrs De's Schooling
 & Spencer both come. After they went out on the sidewalk
 they talked about a quarter of an hour, I suppose they
 were talking about Mary but I do not know.
 Grandmother and Aunt Lucy have washed to-day &
 ironed and Aunt Lucy has been up town.
 May 29th This afternoon Mary & Eliza went to the
 Parker House in a Cabulet, to see a Dr Boardman
 that is the way and me went up town and
 went to Mrs. When we come back we staid till
 6 o'clock, Mother & Aunt Lucy were there, Aunt
 Lucy has made a visit to-day, we went up
 to Mrs Lewis to night and she said she could
 take me and would like to have me come next
 Monday so I guess I shall go if nothing happens.
 May 30th It is a rainy day to-day, Mary has
 up to the Dr's again to-day, Mother & Aunt
 Lucy are making Grandmother this cap, it to-day,
 Caroline came up here and spent the afternoon to-day
 May 31st This afternoon it thundered & lightened &
 rained very hard indeed, the lightning struck a
 pole & tore it all to pieces down by Krennel's.
