

11 Remarks on Friday July 14th 1854  
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with cloudy & thick & rainy weather.  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho by spells wind from NNE to NE steering by the wind to the  
Eastward watch Empty, a in ships duty between Noon & 2  
2 o'clock at sun down Boston sail middle & latter part of  
the day fresh breeze from SSW to SSE & slightly & rainy  
at 6 A.M. weather by spells at 7 A.M. we're ship to the Eastward about noon  
BR 29<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> ho clear - made some sail watch Empty, a in ships duty to noon  
Left in 7 o'clock 33-38 N Long in 7 chronometer 50.42 west

12 Remarks on Saturday July 15th 1854  
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from SSE & fair  
BR 29<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> ho weather steering by the wind to the Eastward watch Empty, a  
ships duty various kinds of work abeam down Boston sail &  
we're ship to the SSE to mid point strong breeze latter part fine  
breeze & fair weather at 5 A.M. have sail watch Empty, a  
at 6 A.M. about the ship saw two seals at half past 11 o'clock a ship to the  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho Eastward so made this way good weather  
Left in 7 o'clock 33-38 N Long in 7 chronometer 50.42 west

13 Remarks on Sunday July 16th 1854  
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from SSE & fine  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho weather steering by the wind to the Eastward watch Empty, a  
ships duty one whaling to the windward & one Amakent big &  
one uncharted quarter steering to the NW, we signalled a fine  
breeze at sun down Boston sail at 3 the barque D Franklin spoke  
with us I went on board at half past 9 come home & steer'd to the SSW  
at 6 A.M. latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 3 A.M. we're  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho ship to the NE to abeam sail at 10 o'clock ship to the ESE early  
the wind raw jumps so made this day nothing in sight  
Left in 7 o'clock 33-40 N Long in 7 chronometer 50.44 west

14 Remarks on Monday July 17th 1854  
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from SSE & fair weather  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho steering by the wind to the ESE abeam Boston sail middle & latter  
part of the day light winds from NE to East watch Empty, a is breaking out from  
at 6 A.M. hole after such & severe un-arms sail steering by the wind to the NW abeam noon  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho ship to the South Left in 7 o'clock 34.04 N Long in 7 chronometer 50.47 west

15 Remarks on Tuesday July 18th 1854  
There 24 Hours begins with light winds from S to SSE & pleasant weather  
at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the South watch Empty, a is steering off the fore hole  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho former the forenoon the last 11' cabin was lost the deck main spar went  
down for top mast staysail saw black man Grampus at sun down  
Boston sail middle & latter part of the day light winds from the  
SSE & fine pleasant weather abeam hole deck sail at 7 o'clock ship  
to the ESE watch Empty, a is slightly breaking out the after  
hole after sugar cane apples & other things at 9 saw A sperm  
at 6 A.M. whale off our bow quarter going quick to the WNW we turned  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho boat for him & he went out of sight of boat & ship so made  
this day off after A whale coming on board  
Left in 7 o'clock 34.10 N Long in 7 chronometer 50.42 west

16 Remarks on Wednesday July 19th 1854  
There 24 Hours begins with light winds from SSW & pleasant  
at 6 P.M. weather boats off after a whale at half past 1 P.M. boats come on  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho board & we steer'd with NW finished getting out our stuff  
out of the after hole & stow'd off saw one schooner off our starboard  
bow at 11 P.M. saw on her strong sail at 3 P.M. we law to  
schooners boats down after the same whale that were law'd for at 6  
we saw the whale shoot between the schooner & her boat the boat  
went on board at sun down Boston sail & steer'd by the wind to the SSW  
middle & latter part of the day light winds from SSE & pleasant  
at 6 A.M. weather at 5 had all sail at 7 o'clock a ship to the Eastward abeam  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho off our bow steering the same watch Empty, a in ships duty  
so made this day fine pleasant weather  
Left in 7 o'clock 34.10 N Long in 7 chronometer 50.45 west

17 Remarks on Thursday July 20th 1854  
at 6 P.M. There 24 Hours begins with light winds from SSW & smooth sea  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho pleasant weather now all sail steering to the Eastward bearing  
East wind from SSE watch Empty, a in ships duty one schooner  
off our bow quarter steering the same we saw black fish going  
at 6 A.M. quick at sun down Boston sail middle & latter part of the day light  
BR 29<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ho winds from the SSE & pleasant weather abeam sail & steer'd to SSE  
by the wind raw on sail & steer'd out of sight so made this day  
Left in 7 o'clock 34.04 N Long in 7 chronometer 50.45 west
