

Thursday May 21<sup>st</sup> 1903

Light breeze and fine weather  
At three P. M. got under way and  
towed to Vineyard Sound light ship  
at 6 P. M. tug left, made sail heading  
west at 8 went about heading S. E. by E.  
Gay Head light bearing E. S. E. about  
5 miles distance. Latter part fresh  
breeze and pleasant weather steering  
S. E. by S.

Friday 22<sup>nd</sup>

This day commences with fresh  
breeze squally weather employed  
in stowing cables and anchors.  
and begun to get boats ready at  
3 P. M. saw a large school of Black  
Fish. Latter part strong breeze from  
N. E. bark steering S. E. Employed  
in putting lines in tubs and doing  
other jobs. one steamer in sight.

Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup>

This day begins with strong breeze.  
from the N. E. and squally weather  
bark steering S. E. Latter part light  
breeze. Two steamers in sight. Doing  
odd jobs.

First part of this light breeze  
from the north bark steering S. E. by  
E. Latter part Calm employed

in stowing the hold.

the E. bark going on the starboard tack  
under short sail latter part fresh breeze  
Employed in stowing.

Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day strong breeze  
from the E. S. E. bark laying to on  
the port tack latter part fresh breeze  
At 8 A. M. man at the wheel raised  
a school of sperm whales got boats  
ready and lowered those boats the  
L. B. got fast and the W. B. got fast the  
L. B. lost the whale and the W. B. got  
a small one the B. B. capsize. got  
the whale along side at 11 A. M. and  
started to get ready to cut in. Two sails  
in sight.
