

Sept 1 First day of this month comes with light S.E. Breeze wind and fine clear weather Bk. steers N. by N. with all sails out watches employed at various ship duty, saw two Steamers latter squally with rain

Sept 2 This day begun with fresh Breeze and squally weather Bk. steering by the wind under upper topsails spoke out the last bag of Sugar latter heavy squalls with rain and large seas

Sept 3 Today commences with strong Breeze wind and rough seas Bk. under lower topsails steering N. by N. saw five masted Schooners lately wind moderately and made all sails and changed the course N. N. W. latter wind dying out to a calm

Sept 4 These 24 hours calm weather Bk. laying around under all sails out, watches employed in mending the old main lower topsails spoke with a steamer name Titania from New York at longitude 67.28 lately struck a little Breeze and steers NW. latter as much as yesterday one steamer in sight

Sept 5 all through this day very light Breeze and foggy like Bk. steering N. N. W. under all sails out watches employed in mending Layrtopsail latter squally with rain saw two Steamers

Sept 6 These 24 hours commences with light Breeze and pleasant weather Bk. under all sails out heading along. N. N. W. crew employed in mending the fore upper topsail and doing some painting latter much as first

Sept 7 Today begun with light Breeze and fine clear Bk. steering N. N. W. under all sails set, men employed at ship works raised school of sperm whales by jack lopes and hooked down the four boats starboard B. struck and the other boats chased without any chance come on board and got cutting gears up and cutt him - m - also one steamer in sight saw the whales again but did not bother anymore for they was going quick to windwards.

Sept 8 This day comes with tick fog and light Breeze wind Bk. heading N. by W. under all sails out saw four fishing Schooners employed in washing off the paint and hauling up the chain and bend the cable. saw few Steamers at 5.40 PM. saw light of Longhead at 3.30 AM. dropped anchor.

Sept 9 Today at an anchor employed in took the things out of the boats and clearing away the end of voyage. do Sept 9, 1815
