

Tuesday July 21st 1857

Moderate and clear from the Southward heading to the Eastward, saw nothing, sunset the same, hauled the boat to leave the crew to pull.

Middle part the same

Latter part very light from the Southward, steering E. N. E. saw some Crampfish Late Ob. 31° 48' N Long 13. C. 47. 58. W.

Wednesday 22nd

Very light winds from the S. E. steering E. N. E. saw nothing, sunset the same

Middle and latter part the same steering the same. Late Ob. 32° 20' N Long 13. C. 47. 10. W.

Thursday 23rd

Almost calm, steering E. N. E. at 10. m. hauled for a station but could not get it, sunset the same middle part calm

Latter part very light from the S. E. steering E. N. E. Late Ob. 32° 42' N Long 13. C. 47. 20. W.

Friday 24th

Com's with moderate breeze from the South and clear heading E. N. E. saw a sail to leeward sunset the same

Middle and latter part the same steering E. N. E. saw a sail on our S. bow heading to the S. E. saw porpoises and Crampfish bounds

Late Ob. 33° 23' N Long 13. C. 46. 55. W.

Saturday 25th

Com's with light winds from the S. W. and clear, steering N. E. saw some Crampfish at 5. P. m. spoke the steamer Perry Eschol of and from Provincetown, Middle 2nd months out alone, had seen one whale, saw along Bark take a whale on the 1st at 7. P. m. hauled forward to the N. E. all sail out.

Middle part the same

Latter part equally and sailing, at daylight took in the light sails at 6. A. m. took in two tops

Saw a sail in sight to leeward. Late Ob. 33° 30' N Long 13. C. 46. 20. W.

and hauled forward to the N. W.

Middle and latter part moderate, lying off and on getting off recruits, the Bark Rothschild in company

Monday August 1st 1857

Com's with moderate weather, lying off and on took on board 150. bushels of potatoes and 300 lb. of onions the mate and boat crew on shore, at 5. P. m. the boat came on board with all but Charles Olney, mate's boat steerer he was on the beach when the boat shoved off, was too weak the mate from drinking, the mate and I mate both told him to get in the boat, but he made no answer the mate after calling him twice shoved off and left him

Middle and latter part very light and clear heading to the Eastward, Late Ob. 39° 37' N

Tuesday 18th

Com's with moderate breeze from the Westward heading to the Eastward, sails in sight at 1.5 m. haul away for station, plenty of Crampfish bounds, sunset the same

Middle and latter part calm Late Ob. 40° 04' N Long 13. C. 36. 34. W.

Wednesday 19th

Com's with very light winds from the Westward and clear heading to the Eastward at 4. paper along bay of timber caught one dolphin and 13. white fishes very much like our Rock Cods, sunset the same

Middle and latter part moderate and clear heading to the Northward, at daylight no land in sight, sunset porpoises in sight but could not strike on Late Ob. 41° 18' N Long 13. C. 31. 15. W.

Thursday 20th

Com's with moderate winds and clear from the S. W., heading North, saw nothing but a forebark sunset the same took in sail, and hauled once

Middle part the same

Latter part strong breeze at 10. A. m. double reef the top sails, saw some forebark

Late Ob. 41° 45' N Long 13. C. 32. 00. W.

Friday 21st

Com's with strong breeze from the S. W. and equally and evening weather heading to the S. E. at 1.30. took in the courses, etc. and for top sail heading N. W. sunset moon moderate, Middle part fresh gales at 2. A. m. along ship paper return of us steering N. E. Latter the same, steering S. E. under 11. 2. sail and fore sail and 2. reef fore top sail.

Late Ob. 41° 26' N Long 31. 16. W.
