

Monday Aug 4 1884

Begins with a brisk breeze from West  
The weather clear made all sail steering like the  
Captain found Wadson Freeman the Cook to  
be a very dirty man and no Cook. Turned him  
Foreward and took John Ferguson a Fore  
mast hand and put him in Cook. Middle  
& Latter part a light breeze from the same  
Today is a Wash Day Thus ends the Day  
Broke out Wall

Tuesday Aug 5. 1884

Begins with a light breeze from SW  
The weather clear The vessel under all sail  
steering steady & all hands employed in washing  
& supplied some steamer Mastan Bound see account  
of Lampers Middle part much the same Latter  
part a light breeze from SW to SE heading the  
ship off N by E Tack ship at 6 P.M. heading S and  
again at 11 P.M. heading E by N employed in  
Rigging out the bottom stage Thus ends Day

Latitude 35..30 N  
Longitude 60..11 W  
Wednesday Aug 6. 1884

Begins with a light breeze from SW  
The vessel under all sail heading from E to  
E by N employed in Rigging the storm top sail  
and sundry other jobs and Barks in sight  
on the same Tack Middle & Latter part a  
light breeze from SW The vessel heading E and E by N  
several sails in sight sent up Tack and Broke  
out Coffee Rice Sugar Campers Beans and  
Bread &c This ends the Day

Latitude 36..34 N  
Longitude 58..27 W

Thurs Aug 7. 1884

Begins with a moderate breeze from  
SE The Schooner under all sail heading E by N  
employed in breaking out for the sail Barks  
did not find it several sails in sight at  
6 A.M. Tacked ship heading S and S by W  
Middle & Latter part light air from SE  
most of the time ship on Different Tacks  
heading S by W on one Tack E by N on the other  
employed in breaking out several sails in sight  
Thus ends the Day

Latitude 36..43 N  
Longitude 58..17 W

Friday Aug 8. 1884

Begins with light breeze from SE The  
ship under all sail heading S on one Tack  
& by N on the other employed in breaking out  
the Cordage Cask and sail Casks in the  
Fore Hold Port and starboard side 2 sails in sight  
Middle & Latter part a brisk breeze a part of the  
time from the same employed in sundry jobs  
about the ship the Capt made a new Caboose Cover  
or Tray Works cover a steamer in sight Thus ends  
the Day

Latitude 36..43 N  
Longitude 57..52 W  
Saturday Aug 9. 1884

Begins with a light breeze from SE The  
ship under all sail heading S the SW employed in  
fitting up the ship finished the Tray works Cover  
Middle part the same Latter part the wind  
blew up some from the same at 9 o'clock P.M.  
Raised a Breach on our starboard Beam 2 miles  
off Run off for it did not see it arg in it proved  
to be a quaker War ship heading E Thus ends  
the Day
