

Bark Alfred Gibbs Cruising N.E. of Bermuda.

Remarks Friday June 3rd 1880
Begins with pleasant breezes from W & W. Course
S. & E. at sundown shortened sail. Latter part
light air. at 7 1/2 A.M. saw a school of small whales
going quick to the windward. picked two boats
Creels and lowered the S & W boats. at 10 1/2 they
struck one 6 miles to the windward of the bark.
so ends the boats towing. Lat 36-103 Long 68-45
8 Days out to sea.

Remarks Saturday June 4th
Begins with light air from S. at 2 1/2 P.M.
took the whale along side, at 4 1/2 commenced
cutting. at 6 finished. Latter part calm.
at 6 1/2 A.M. commenced boiling.

Remarks Sunday June 5th
Begin with light winds and calms
Employed boiling. Raised a school of small
whales to the windward lowered S &
W Boats the S Boat struck one, lowered the
other Boats But the whales made us stop.
Lat 36-20 Long 68 1/2

Remarks Monday June 6th
Begins with fresh breezes from the
South at 1 1/2 P.M. took the whale
along side at 2 1/2 commenced cutting
at 4 1/2 finished at 9 started fires
Lat 36.11 Long 62.20.

Remarks Tuesday June 7th
Begins with moderate breezes from
the South at 5 P.M. finished boiling
the whale turned up 26 Bills the other
17 Bills. At 6 A.M. raised whales to
the windward. at 11 lowered and struck
three the S & W Boats got four lines
and had to cut. Got two One to S &
one to W Boats they killed two.
