

Seth Hattie E. Smith's Journal

Thursday October 1<sup>st</sup> 1885 Sailed  
From New Bedford on a Voyage  
of Whaling. W. S. Taber Master  
W. H. Battle Mate & Odger second  
Matti. B. North third Mate. at 11.20  
P.M. Discharged Pilot. Light winds  
from N.E. at 4 P.M. Lat. 41° 04' N.  
Course S.S.W. Long. 71° 02' W.  
Chose Watchers and Boat Crews. Stowed  
Anchors and Chains.

Friday October 2<sup>nd</sup>

These 24 Hours comes in with  
fresh winds from E. Set steering A.S.W. Dan  
Perpois. Saw two seals and a Steamer. latter  
Part more moderate. Handled the main gaff  
Top sail on account of steering saw two seals  
and a Steamer. Winds light from E. by N.  
Set steering A.W. employed on the boats.  
Lat. 38° 13' N.  
Long. 72° 10' W.

Saturday Oct 3<sup>rd</sup>

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh  
winds from W. Set on S.W. tack. Split the  
fore staysail unbent and repaired it and bent it  
again. latter part winds were still on opposite tack  
Saw a Steamer. Sighted a whale about four miles  
set the mainsail and worked to windward but saw  
no more of it. at dark tacked to W. by S.  
Lat. 37° 33' N.  
Long. 73° 22' W.

Sunday October 4<sup>th</sup>

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh  
winds from S.W. Set on S. tack. had a heavy gale  
at 2 A.M. split the foresail. Saw two sulphur  
bottoms. Employed repairing foresail. latter part  
at 2 P.M. set the foresail. at 4 P.M. had a gale  
from N.W. Handled mainsail and flying jib. at 5 P.M.  
Set steering S.S.W. Lat. 37° 17' N.  
Long. 73° 54'
