

Log of Sch Kettle E Smith  
Sailed from Edgartown Thursday  
June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1892 Westerly Wind Anchored in  
Tarpaulin Cove about one o'clock took the  
coal from under the forecabin and  
put it under the stowage to trim ship

June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1892  
Got under way about 8 o'clock light  
soberly winds all day bent by sail  
rigging boats Lat 41.30 Long 76.52

June 4<sup>th</sup>  
Lat 40.30 Long 71.25  
Raised Humpbacks - also two  
square rigged ships - Been rigging

June 5<sup>th</sup>  
Lat 39.24 Long 72.04  
Two Steamers and several sailing  
vessels in sight today sighted  
Porpoises for the first time  
steering S. S. W.

June 6<sup>th</sup>  
Lat 38.26 Long 72.44 strong breeze  
S. W. hove out run & main hatch  
on starboard tack head south  
sighted Steamer

June 7<sup>th</sup>  
Lat 37.38 Long 72.03 light N.E.  
wind steering West been getting  
stage over to other gear ready  
several sail in sight

June 8<sup>th</sup>  
Lat 37.20 Long 73.04 light S.  
wind calm seen several schools  
of Porpoise & several pieces of  
Squid hauled for a bbl and  
weight about 20 lbs fish one  
sail in sight so ends this day
