

1841. NOVEMBER WILLIAM WALKER. 1841.
A Journal of a voyage On the "Wreath" Banks this
Commenced with a Gale of wind and with the part a
Windward at 6 Am rising & more moderate at 10
The boats and the Capt. "Boats" got past but did
Get the Whale he cut his line off with his Spade
Lat 36 45 South & Long 39 19 West

November the 1 Day These 24 hours Commenced with
Lowered away the boats at 2 Am & at 5 Am
But did not get any Whale & at 7 Am hauled all
the watches & changed position
Calms & at 8 Am foggy weather
The fog cleared away and a small breeze
And in Lat 36 55 South and in Lon 39 19

November the 2 Day These 24 hours Commenced with
Winds from the S.W. & at 5 Am
Of a right Whale & that was our share
Have the ship has a light wind & at one Calm
Rise a wind at 5 Am all hands to work
The South & West winds
Am took in the main topgallant and saw the
In latitude 37 10 South and in Longitude

November the 3 Day These 24 hours Commenced with
Had at 1 Am rose whales & at 2 lowered
The Mate Struck the whale & the
Got him along side & cut him in two
Dealings and out to port Strong breeze at 3
All Coupled & Cleared away the head & set
Try war as to going & N. Right whale
But that was our share
In Lat 37 44 West & in Lon 39 19
