Wednesday 14th

Commences and ends with fair weather employed washing Ship together with other jobs &

Thursday 15th

Commences and ends with fine weather Capt on shore except at meals times &

Monday 16th

Commences and ends with fine weather employed breaking out stocks and other jobs three men hired from shore &

Tuesday 17th

Commences and ends with fine weather employed on various jobs Capt on shore most of the time &

Wednesday 18th

Commences and ends with fine weather employed in the Ship holes obtaining Casks and wood &

Thursday 19th

Commences and ends with fine weather employed regulating Casks and other things between decks &

Friday 20th

Commences and ends with fine weather employed regulating between decks &

Saturday 21st

Commences and ends with fine weather employed on small jobs to numerous to make mention &

Sunday 22nd

Commences and ends with fair weather Capt on shore to Church &

Monday 23rd

Commences with rain ends more pleasant employed on small jobs make sick &

Tuesday 24th

Commences with fair weather ends the same employed on various jobs Capt on shore most of the time &

Wednesday 25th

Commences with unpleasant ends the same with a rain storm this day employed Landing Old Iron & sundries of the Deck and selling it Auctions & employed three men from shore half a day to help land &

Thursday 26th

Commences unpleasant ends with a storm this day sold a main yard also top plank yards to the Soloway also 500 hundred lbs of Shocks to the Galley &

Friday 27th

Commences and ends with a storm &

Saturday 28th

Commences and ends with a rain storm &

Sunday 29th

Commences with more pleasant weather & ends ends the same &

Monday 30th

Commences with pleasant weather and a strong wind ends the same employed four men from shore to help get some Spum on Deck and other jobs &

Tuesday 31st

Commences with pleasant weather blowing strong from East North East employed on small jobs &

Wednesday Feb 7th 1859

Commences with pleasant weather blowing strong from the same Capt on shore employed on small jobs &

Thursday 8th

Commences with good weather ends the same blowing fresh from East North East Capt on shore employed on various jobs for use &

Friday 9th

Commences and ends with fine weather blowing fresh in squalls from North East this day sold and packed two Sarsaparilla and one Lower yard &

Saturday 10th

Commences with a moderate rain storm this day employed four men from shore to ball the Ship to a suitable place to hoist her for she is now laying a ground on the reef which is caused by her dragging her Anchor & so into the Log of Ship Herald she has & the towards her anchor Harbor &
