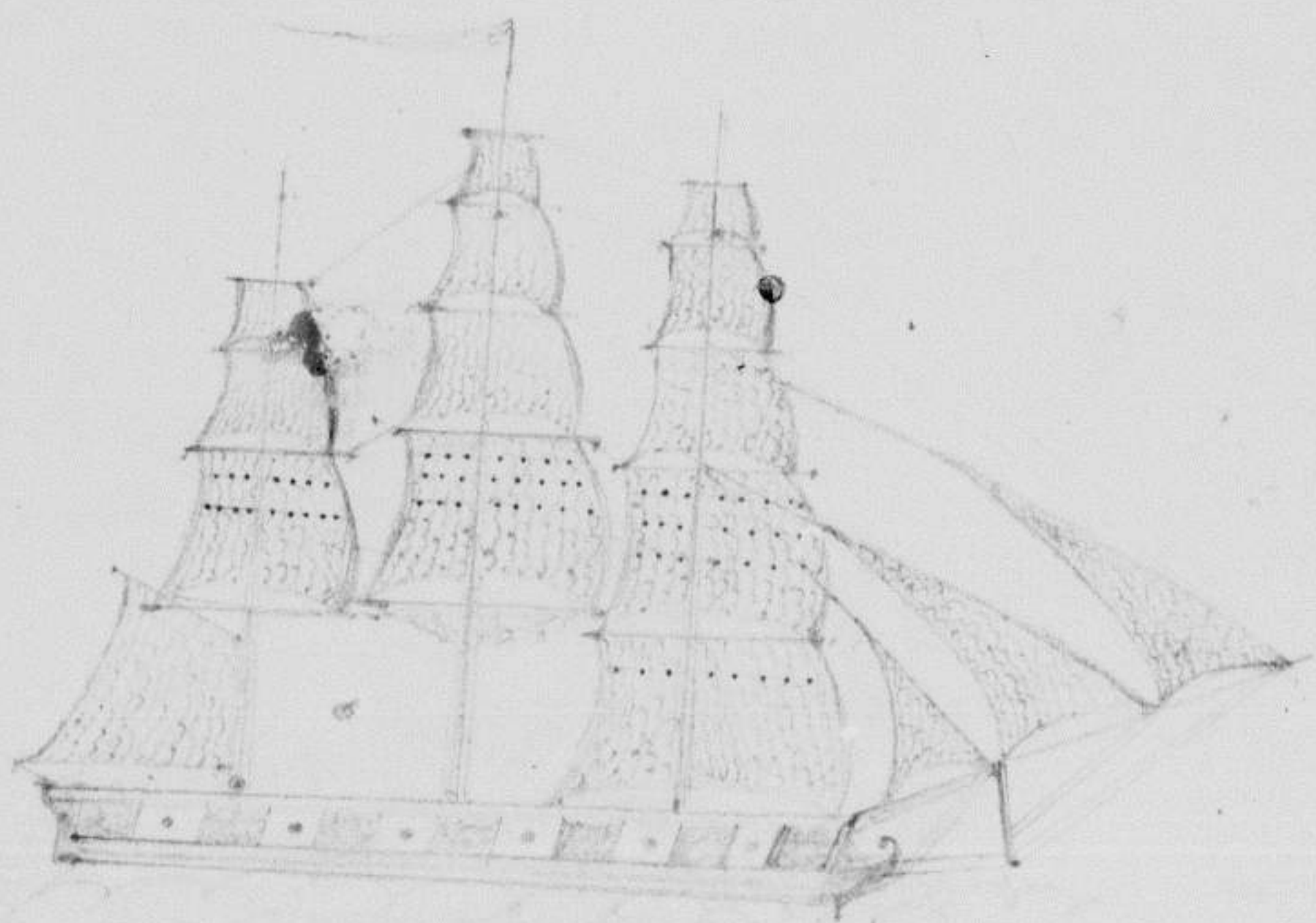


A Journal Kept On Board

August 5th 1835



Wednesday August 5th 1835
At 8 A.M. weighed our anchor and sailed
from the harbour of New Bedford with Pleasant
Breezes from the N. N. W. and fine weather
At 5 P.M. Left our Pilot and stood to see
500 Cncls these 24 hours Lat -

Thursday August 6th 1835
All these 24 hours moderate breezes and cloudy
weather Unbent our cables and stowed the
Anchor at Mercian Made Gayhead Bearing
N by West Dist 15 Leagues 50 Cncls Lat -

Friday August 7th 1835
All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward
steering S. S. East 50 Cncls Lat - 39. 30. N,

Saturday August 8th 1835
All these 24 hours strong winds with frequent
squalls of Rain Course East by South Lat - 39. 32. N,

Sunday August 9th 1835
All these 24 hours strong winds with Rain Course
East by South by Compass Lat by Obs - 39. 00. N,

Monday August 10th 1835
All these 24 hours strong breezes and pleasant weather
All hands Employed in ships Duty winds from
N. N. West Course East by South by Compass 50 Cncls -
Lat by Obs - 38. 32. N, Long -

Tuesday August 11th 1835
These 24 hours commenced with moderate breezes
from the N, and Eastward and pleasant weather
Miscellaneous and latter parts much the same
steering the same as above 50 Cncls, Lat - 38. 27. N,
