and fair weather employed hauling and stowing down  
middle part fine weather steering to the Westward  
at 11 P.M. finished hauling latter part fresh breeze  
from the Westward steering to the Westward employed  
hauling down boards Lat 11° 35' 00" South  
Long 3° 50' East

Remarks On Tuesday Oct 25<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh breeze from the Westward  
steering to the Southward at 3 P.M. commenced hauling  
down at 4 P.M. hauled to the Southward  
Middle part fresh gale and squally  
Latter part moderate the same to end  
Lat 11° 35' 00" South

Remarks On Wednesday Oct 26<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with strong gale from the South  
steering to the Westward under short sail saw one  
whale to the Southward heading to the East  
Middle part attended with squalls of Rain and hales  
Latter part more moderate employed  
hauling down boards Lat 11° 35' 00" South

Remarks On Board Thursday Oct 27<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh gale from the South  
steering to the Westward under short sail  
Middle part moderate gale and fair weather  
Latter part light breeze from the Westward steering to  
the Westward under short sail top sail and  
bent another one to end this Day  
Lat 11° 34' 20" South Long by Chronometer 6° 48' E

Remarks On Board Friday Oct 28<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze and fair weather  
steering to the Westward employed hauling  
the main top sail Middle part strong breeze  
steering to the East  
Latter part moderate wind and fair weather  
at 11 P.M. saw a ship to the Southward  
Lat 11° 32' 00" South Long 7° 30' East

Remarks On Saturday Oct 29<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh breeze from the South  
at 1 P.M. spoke the Albatross Fairway 7 Whales  
Middle part attended with squalls of Rain  
steering to the Eastward Latter part fresh breeze  
and squally at 7 P.M. were ship to the Westward  
boards Lat 11° 32' 00" South Long 7° 48' East

Remarks On Sunday Oct 30<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh breeze from the SSE  
steering to the Westward  
Middle part moderate the same  
Latter part fresh breeze and squally at 7 P.M.  
saw one whale hauled could not quarter  
at 10 saw one more hauled again struck and sunk  
her but only limp and four pieces to end  
Lat by D.R. 32° 50' South

Remarks On Monday Oct 31<sup>st</sup>  
Commenced with moderate breeze from the East  
and squally at 5 P.M. saw two whales hauled  
boards at 6 P.M. Middle part moderate the same  
Latter part moderate breeze and fair weather  
saw a ship ahead at 7 P.M. saw number of Whales  
at 8 hauled struck and killed one of them at 11 took  
her along side at noon Commenced hauling  
Lat 11° 32' 00" South

Remarks On Tuesday November 1<sup>st</sup> 1831  
Commenced with moderate breeze and fair  
weather at 4 P.M. finished hauling at 6 Commenced  
hauling Middle part light winds from the SW  
Latter part fresh breeze and squally at 3 P.M.  
spoke the ship under command of Wainwright to  
Lat 11° 32' 00" South

Remarks On Board Wednesday November 2<sup>nd</sup> 1831  
Commenced with strong gale from the S.W. 13<sup>th</sup> at  
and squally employed hauling  
Middle part gale increased no matter could not  
quart at midnight under the W Boat and Bow  
of the foreward Deck saw the Boat and all  
Boards to her latter part the gale abated  
at 11 P.M. began to haul again boards Lat 11° 32' 00" South  
Long by Chronometer 8° 34' East

Remarks On Thursday November 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commenced with moderate gale and fair weather  
employed hauling  
Middle part light breeze from the SW  
steering to the East  
Latter part fine pleasant weather at 3 P.M. saw number  
of Whales hauled struck one of them and dressed from  
him some on Board at 11 hauled again struck one  
Whale and sunk him to end Lat by D.R. 32° 00' South

Remarks On Friday November 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze and fair weather  
at 6 P.M. saw two Whales hauled struck one of them  
dressed from him some on Board and took in sail  
Middle part fresh breeze from the Westward steering to  
the Westward at 8 P.M. saw a ship a sailing latter part  
fresh gale from the South employed hauling down boards  
Lat 11° 32' 00" South

Remarks On Saturday November 5<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh gale from the South and  
fair weather at 5 P.M. finished hauling down  
Middle part strong gale at 8 P.M. were ship to the  
Westward Latter part strong gale from the East  
at 7 P.M. spoke the ship Cape Flower 3 months from  
Rio de Janeiro to end this Day  
Lat 11° 32' 00" South Long by Chronometer 9° 07' East

Remarks On Sunday November 6<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with strong gale from the East  
steering to the Westward  
Middle part moderate the same  
Latter part heavy weather saw two Right  
Whales to end Lat 11° 32' 00" South Long by D.R. 8° 44' East

Remarks On Monday November 7<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh gale from the East and fair  
saw number Whales at 10 P.M. spoke the ship  
New Bedford 1100 Middle part moderate the same  
Latter part more moderate at 10 P.M. set the  
fore and main top sails and let one reef out the  
main top sail under the fore sail and bent  
another one employed hauling the fore sail  
Lat 11° 32' 43" South Long by Chronometer 9° 02' East

Remarks On Tuesday November 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh breeze from the SE East and  
fair weather heading to the West  
Middle part moderate gale and foggy  
Latter part moderate the same at 8 P.M. saw  
one whale hauled two boats could not get to  
at 9 hauled again struck and killed one Whale at 10  
took her along side and commenced cutting  
to end Lat by D.R. 32° 50' South

Commenced with moderate breeze from the SE East  
and squally at 5 P.M. finished cutting and began to  
haul Middle part moderate the same  
Latter part fresh breeze and squally at 8 P.M.
