Bark Hope to the Atlantic and  
Indian Oceans Captain Charles H. Robbins  
Commander sailed August the 17. 1850  
at 10 A.M. with the wind from north East  
steering south S. East with fine weather

Bark Hope Outward Bound 1850  
Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> Aug commence with fine breezes from the N.E.  
and cloudy at 6 P.M. lost sight of the main land  
steering S. S. E. ends with strong breezes and cloudy. Saw  
several sails steering to the westward

Monday Aug 19<sup>th</sup> Strong winds from the N and cloudy  
breezed weather steering S. E. by E employed fitting  
the boats with two men lines

some rain steering S. E. by E and E. S. E. employed  
fitting the boats for whaling

the N. N. W. and pleasant weather steering E. S. E. employed  
setting up rigging and fitting the boats

and pleasant weather steering east employed at ships duty

employed fitting rigging. Saw 2 sails steering to the south
