Saturday Oct 25<sup>th</sup>

This day commences with light winds from the northward steering south east by about two sails in sight standing to the south the watch at work making spun yarn and plane ing booms. the cook at work getting fish and potatoes ready for dinner. in the afternoon sent up fore topsail stud ing bar boom and main top gallant sail boom. and also painted the booms. in the evening took in main royal and edewed up the top gallant sails weather squally. so ends this day.

Sunday Nov 1<sup>st</sup>

this day commences with a good breeze from the eastward steering close to the wind all hands idle. duff for dinner. in the morn ing took in the fore and main top gallant sails. seven sails in sight steering to the south at sunset trimmed sheets. so ends this day

Wednesday

Monday Nov 2<sup>nd</sup>

This day commences with a good breeze from the eastward steering close to the wind one sail in sight a bark steering south south east. the watch at work strip ping old rope and knotting the yarns for line. the rigging signalled a merchant men in the afternoon which turned fin back. about sunset hauled up the fore and mainsail and about 12 at night set them again. winds very light. so end this day



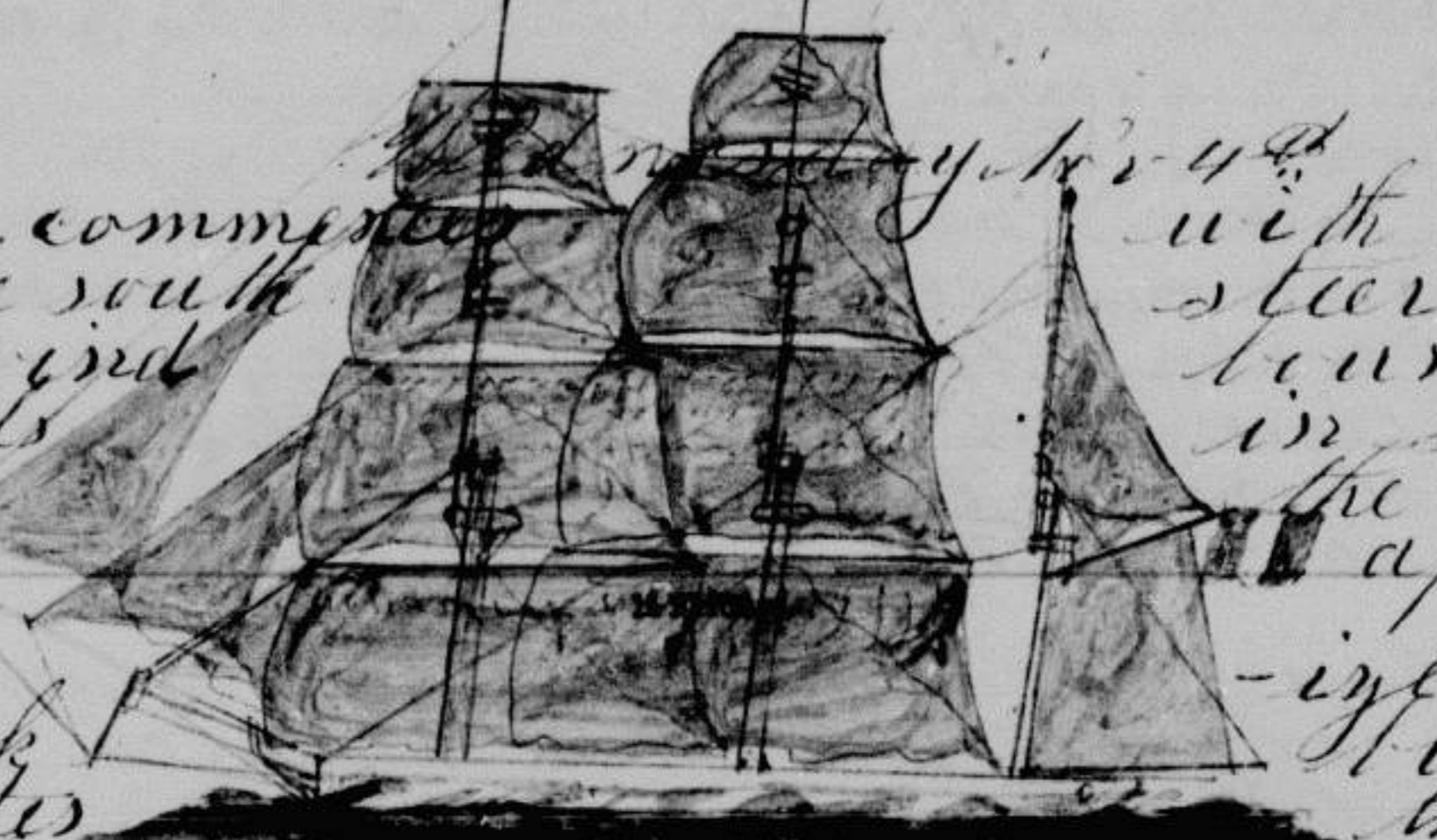
JANUARY

This day commences with strong winds from the south steering close to the wind. the watch at work making scrub by one belt and scraping the tools. in the morn ing took in the main and main top gall ant sails. and in the afternoon set them. the officers and boatsteerers making spade poles and spikes and gafts. at five o'clock cleaned up decks and trimmed sheets. so ends this day.

Friday Nov 6<sup>th</sup>

This day commences with light winds from the eastward steering close to the wind found south under all sail. but main royal. the watch at work making a square mat and knotting rope yarns. the boatsteerers at work in the rigging and are painting and making scrub by one belt at five o'clock cleaned up decks. about twelve took a ship and stood to the southward. about sunset saw a school of porpoise but did not fasten. so ends this day.
