their ships during lat of long
so ends this 24 hours

Sunday
This Day land with strong
winds steering W by N
baring all possible at 5 PM
saw to sails steering N N E
all hands employed in ships
during the later part match
the sain so ends this 24 hours

This Day land with strong winds
and rainy weather W by N
baring all possible sail
the watch employed in ships
during the later part the wind
blew hard we stuck in the fore
and main topsail and paid
the mainsail
so ends this 24 hours
