New Bedford May 10 1845
Thirty days after date here Value
Received I promise to pay to S M G
an order the sum of one hundred
dollars with interest

Saturday 12th
This day came with light winds and
fine weather at 5 AM we commenced hauling
2 ships in sight and we hauling 3 others from
the land in a dead calm expecting to go a
shore so ends this 24 hours lat 49 30 N

Sunday 13th
This day came with strong winds and fine
weather at 9 AM we bent a new top sail and
a new main top sail the rain a hauling 3
ships in sight one of them a hauling
the latter part the wind blowing fresh
and we shortened sail so ends this 24 hours

Monday 14th
This day came with light winds and fine
weather all hands employed in hauling
oil the latter part we saw whales and
after them the second haul got fast and
and from him two ships in sight a
cutting fore got through hauling at
10 AM so ends this 24 hours lat 49 30 N

Tuesday 15th
This day came with light winds and fine
weather all hands employed in hauling
whale at 6 AM we spoke the ship Pennell
of Nantucket and the splendid both of them
a hauling 2 ships in sight this 24 hours lat 49 30 N

Wednesday 16th
This day came with light winds and fine
weather all hands employed in hauling
oil at 4 AM we got three and three we
lowered down and the mail got fast and
and killed him we got him a long side
at 11 AM and cut till 4 in the morning
before we got him in so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 17th
This day came with strong winds and
fine weather at 2 AM we commenced hauling
5 ships in sight and 3 of them a hauling
at 5 AM we spoke the ship Henry of Nantucket
so ends this 24 hours

Friday 18th
This day came with a heavy gale of wind
from the N.E. at 6 AM we called down the
hauling so ruff sail in sight and close to
land at 3 AM the weather cleared down
and we started the work again at 4
we spoke the ship Splendide and had a gam
so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 19th Aug 1849
This day came with strong winds and fine
weather 2 of our boats went on shore
and we had a small chat with the
Reuben ladies and the same time looking
out for whale 5 ships in sight and
2 of them got a whale a piece
so ends this 24 hours lat 49 30 N

Sunday 20th
This day came with strong winds and
bad weather at 4 AM we got three
at 5 AM the ship Henry of Nantucket
and spoke us she was a hauling the latter
came on board of us and we had a small
gam so ends this 24 hours lat 49 30 N
