

Remarks on Board Brig Jubla 1838 3

Tuesday May 14th At 7 A.M. all hands on board weighed anchor and made sail. Steved down the Bay. The tug boat towed us in company with a schooner left us at 1 P.M. made several tacks at 9 P.M. Gay Head light bearing N distant 15. calm latter light S.S.W. Bays from the S.S.W.

Wednesday May 15th commences with a breeze from the S.S.W. the sailing to the N.E. increasing to a gale at 10 P.M. lost S. B. Brig lying to under main sails

Thursday May 16th moderate gale from the N. Brig steering S.S.W.

Friday May 17th moderate Gale N.W. with a large swell steering from S.S.W. to S.W. by E.

Saturday May 18th Strong breeze from N with clear weather steering E. saw several sails headed to the Westward
Lat 37.02. N Lon 64.13

Sunday May 19th a moderate gale from the N.W. with a large swell ship a sea and braked the S. B. Brig by the wind heading under short sail

Monday May 20th first part moderate gale from the N.W. Brig by the wind heading to latter strong breeze made some sails
Lat 37.28. N Lon 60.29. W
