Bristle N.E. winds and fair or other course
N.W. by N. middle part the same. Letter
part course, N.W. by N. part the same.

Sunday 14th

Lat 30° 03' Long 68° 08'

Begins strong winds at 7 AM took a main
square and hauled the wind soon took
a huff from N.W. at 12 mid night
wind shifts suddenly to the N.E. course
course, N.W. by N. Lat 34° 01' 64° 51'

Monday 15th

Bristle N.E. winds and overcast weather,
course N.W. by N. middle part the
same. Letter, part fair winds out N.
but hauling to the Eastward saw a
Hermaphrodite being steered by the wind
to the N.W. over course N.W.

Tuesday 16th

Lat 31° 08' Long 66° 37'

Moderates N.E. carrying all sail, middle
part the same letter, part wind East
sail in sight Lat 32° 23' 68° 08'

Wednesday 17th

Moderates winds from E. to N.E. several
courses, with several sail in sight
middle and letter, part the same
course North Lat 33° 26' Long 68° 52'

Thursday 18th

light winds and fair weather, several
sail in sight N.E. course, middle
part the same letter, part fair course,
N.W. by N. Lat 34° 35' 68° 32'

Friday 19th

Bristle winds and fair weather, course
N.W. by N. middle and letter, part
light winds and calm course N.W. by N.
wind N.W. Lat 35° 34' Long 69° 00'

And most time

Saturday May 20th 1848

Begins with light N.W. winds and fine
weather, with small craft in light winds
N.W. by N. middle part the same letter
part cloudy part a long time Gratto
saw 2 large ships steering E. N.E. winds N.W.

Sunday 21st

Lat 37° 14' Long 70° 00'

Fresh N.W. winds and fair weather,
course N.W. by N. middle part the same letter,
part wind shifts to the S.W. saw a ship running
East

Monday 22nd

Lat 39° 16' Long 71° 24'

Bristle winds N.E. at 4 P.M. shot in
thick Foggy course, N.W. by N. middle part
very thick letter, part the same at 8 A.M.
sailed in 45 fathoms water with the wind
from South to N.E. through the fog banks overbraced

Tuesday 23rd No Obs. Lat 40° 51' by S. 71° 50'

Fresh winds at 9 A.M. wind hauled to the N.E.
saw square sail at 5 spoke the Schooner Virginia
of Freetown 12 hours from Newport bound to Pikes
Isle for Salt James Allen heading N.W.
under short sail weather, thick fog over,
middle part thick letter, part hazy
46 vessels in sight at 6 A.M. saw long
I Island Montock Point bearing N.N.E.
dist 35 m at 11 MSL 6 m dist passed off
Shore sounds Lat

Wednesday 24th

Moderates winds from E. by N. spoke a
fishing smack gall/ cod and 2 dogs mackerel
middle part thick letter, part the same
several small craft in sight some as

Thursday 25th

Off Montocks

Bristle winds and as a fog was
at 2 P.M. saw Montock 2 m dist at 4 spoke
the Schooner Eagle of London 40 days from
Shelved middle part foggy letter, part
letter, clear 40 sail in sight Montock,
Point and Block Island in sight
