

Remarks On Board Ship

Thursday 30th

This day light breeze from the S E
Tacked ship several times 2 two sails
in sight at 70 M took in sail

Friday May 1st

This day calm broke out between Decks
and covered broad beam and sails two sails
in sight at 70 M took in sail

Saturday 2nd

This day begins with light air from the W N W
steering S E E latter part wind light
from N W at 70 M took in sail and came
too on the Starboard tack one sail in
sight

Sunday 3rd

This day begins with a light breeze and
N W increasing at 5 M took in some sail
several sails in sight exchange signals
with a danc. at 70 M took in sail
Lat 36:22

Monday 4th Long

This day begins with a fine breeze from
N W hauled to the S E working east-
ward several sails in sight at 70 M
took in sail ship heads S E by E on
the Starboard tack a very dull fourth

Tuesday 5th

This day strong breeze from the E under
top sails set on the Star tack at 5 M tacked
ship 3 sails in sight at 70 M took
in sail so ends this day with nothing yet

Wednesday 6th

This day strong light and squally from E
to N E at 6 M spoke the Ocean Rover
of Mattapoisett had seen nothing the Capt
Clagh came on board took in sail saw
Charles Hammond

Thursday 7th

This day light breeze from E to N E
on the Starboard tack at 70 M tacked
ship and took in sail nothing in sight

Friday Thursday 8th

This day light breeze from E N E ship
on the Starboard tack nothing in sight
at 70 M took in sail

Saturday Friday 9th

This day light breeze from E N E
ship steering N N W at 1 1/2 M saw
humpback going to windward quick
at 70 M took in sail

Sunday 11th

This day begins with light winds
from S E steering N 4 four sails
in sight at 70 M took in sail
Lat Long

Monday 11th

This day light breeze from the S W to the
S E at 7 M saw a breach at 9 M
saw a sperm whale and stood for him he
working windward faster than the ship
could at 20 M the Star and Gun Boats
lowered but could not catch him at 5 PM
Came on board
