

Remarks on board the Ship *Janet*
Thursday February the 25th 1862
First part very fine & pleasant weather still
steering by the wind heading to the South still
employed set up sheets of sunset saw the land

Course

Wednesday June the 5th 1862
First part light wind from S.W.
steering S.W. with all sail set Middle
& better part calm in harbor with Milton
saw at 11th in the *King's* Bay

Thursday June the 6th
First part commenced with fine weather
still steering S.W. at sunset the Milton
still in sight & was taken out all lights
forward & Double reefed main top sail middle
part light air at Daylight shores of rain & calm
better part light breeze from the W. steering
to the South so in the Day

Friday June the 7th
First part commenced with rain squally
at 3 pm saw black fish the weather very
pleasant still heading to the South at sunset
Double reefed the top sails & took in the main sail
& Vail with wind from East at Daylight
the weather very pleasant better part the
same so in the Day

Saturday June the 8th
First part fine weather at 4 pm saw
S.W. hills at 5 pm lower all the boats &
got me at 1 pm took dinner long sight
at Daylight commenced butting better part
fine weather still butting so in the Day

in the Pacific Ocean leaving for *Sperm* W. Isles
Sunday June the 9th

First part fine pleasant weather
still in port butting at 7 pm finished butting
middle & better part fine weather at 8 pm
commenced boiling the weather squally so in the
Day

Monday June the 10th Boiling
First part squally & rain still employed
at sunset very squally & rain at 10 pm very
pleasant middle & better part fine
& pleasant weather still in port
boiling heading to the South so in the Day

Tuesday June the 11th
First part in plain boiling with fine
weather at 4 pm took ship to the North
heading N.E. saw N. at sunset the
weather very pleasant Middle & better
part pleasant still in plain boiling at
Daylight set for top sail double reefed
& Vail & spanker so in the Day

Wednesday June the 12th
First part moderate weather still in plain
boiling at 3 pm saw a finback at 4 pm
were ship to the South at 6 pm finished
boiling & took in the Vail & spanker & all up
forward Middle & better part moderate
weather at 8 pm set for 4 mizen top sail
& turn the reefed out the new top sail
saw a finback so in the Day
