Saturday April the 3rd 1869

This 24 hours light weather still
employed hauling middle & latter
part the same so ends this day,

Sunday April the 4th

All this 24 hours calm still employ
hauling At latter part finished hauling
so ends this day,

Monday April the 5th

This day commenced with very pleasant
weather one mil insight At one pm saw
Whales heading to the E At 2 pm lower
all boats so ends this day,

Tuesday April the 6th

At first part the Whales still
in sight At sunset the boats came on board
with out success Middle part strong
winds from the S.W. At daylight
commenced hooping the oil & stave it down
so ends this day,

Wednesday April the 7th

This day commenced with moderate
gale from the S.W. the ship heading to the
S.E. under close reefed top sails middle
& latter part still strong winds so ends
this day,

Thursday April the 8th

This day commenced with moderate
gale from the S.W. the ship still heading
S.E. under close reefed top sails the weather
still very squally middle part more moder-
ate At daylight trim and reefed out the
top sails latter part fine light weather
saw nothing so ends this day,

Friday April the 9th

First part commenced with very
fine weather the ship heading W. by N.
middle & latter part still fine weather
saw nothing so ends this day,

Saturday April the 10th

This day commenced with very pleasant
weather the ship heading South At sunset
took in the light sails & double reefed the
top sails & wore ship to the North middle
& latter part very fine weather due purpose
still heading to the North so ends this day,

Sunday April the 11th

This day commenced with very pleasant
weather the ship still heading North At sunset
took in the light sails & double reefed top sails
still heading to the North middle part still
fine weather At daylight wore ship to the
S.E. At 9 Am saw a sperm Whale heading
to the West & the wind from the East At
10 Am lower all boats At 11 AM struck
it so ends this day,
