

Remarks on board the ship James Arnold of New Bedford in South Pacific Ocean Cruising  
Monday April the 12<sup>th</sup> 1869

At first part took the W hall a long side & commenced cutting the weather very cloudy we cut till 8 pm At 11 pm lost the head from long side latter part commenced Bailing the weather still very cloudy so ends this day

Tuesday April the 13<sup>th</sup>  
This day commenced with very cloudy still employed Bailing middle & latter part the same so ends this day

Wednesday April the 14<sup>th</sup>  
This day commenced with very cloudy & moderate winds from the ship heading S.E. At 3 pm finished Bailing At 4 pm took a heavy rain squall At sunset the weather more moderate the ship still heading S.E. by S under double reefed top sail & fore sail middle part very heavy sea on latter part light winds so ends this day

Thursday April the 15<sup>th</sup>  
This day commenced with very heavy sea on & light winds from the middle & latter part the same so ends this day

Friday April the 16<sup>th</sup>  
At first part the weather as last the same middle part thick weather At day light light rain latter part the same so ends this day

New Bedford in South Pacific Ocean Cruising  
Tuesday April the 17<sup>th</sup> 1869

At first part took the W hall a long side & commenced cutting the weather

Monday April the 11<sup>th</sup> 1870  
All this 24 hours light

Monday April the 18<sup>th</sup>  
At first part took the W hall a long side & commenced cutting the weather very cloudy we cut & till 8 pm At 11 pm lost the head from long side latter part commenced Bailing the weather still very cloudy so ends this day

Tuesday April the 19<sup>th</sup>  
This August the 12 1867 James Arnold got home & so ended this voyage
