Remarks Tuesday July 15<sup>th</sup> 1862.

Satter part light breeze from the S.W. at 9.30 Am set the sails then took the Anchor and began to make out of the Bay bound on a Whaling voyage with a crew consisting of twenty six men all told, could not find any cat block

Remarks Wednesday July 16<sup>th</sup>.

Sight breeze from the S.W. employed working out the Bay smoky about 1 Pm carried away main top gallant yard it was done while tacking but how no one knows as the brace was cast off from the pin, also parted the eye to the fore topsail yard while eating supper, at 7 Pm tacked to the Westward the light boat bearing to the E. N.E. about 3 miles off set in thick fog.

Middle part the ship working to the S.W. smoky weather. Satter part light S.W. wind heading S. S.E. employed jibbing the boats, thick and foggy weather saw a Schooner working Southward  
Satt 40. 32 North. Sany 70. 35 West.

Remarks Thursday July 17<sup>th</sup>.

Sight S.W. wind with smoky weather the ship steering S.E. and E. S.E. saw two merchantman steering to the N. W. W.

Middle part light S.W. wind steering E. by S. smoky & haze. Satter part light wind from the Westward steering E. by S. thick fog, at 8 Am saw two schools of Blackfish, employed breaking out, and jibbing another main top gallant yard.

Remarks Friday July 18<sup>th</sup>.

Sight and gust breeze the wind baffling from West to North steering E. by S. took in light sails

Middle part light breeze from the North steering E. by S. Satter part gust breeze baffling to the N.E. with a heavy fog heading S. E. by E. the wind freshening.

Satt 40.00 N. Sany 66. 17 W.

Remarks Saturday July 19<sup>th</sup>.

Strong wind from the E. S.E. heading S. E. by E. the weather quite clear, employed in ship's duty at 4.30 Pm we
