

Ship's Log September the 13<sup>th</sup> 1835

September the 13<sup>th</sup> 1835  
At 10 A.M. raised anchor and set sail  
from Fair Haven for the Western Islands  
at 11 past 11 passed the Round Hills at  
12 M. discharged the Pilot, strong winds  
from S.E. and cloudy weather steering  
S.W. by S.

Monday the 14<sup>th</sup> 1835  
These 24 hours commences fresh winds from  
N.E. under all sail, at 1 P.M. the same  
and Rig, steering South, at 4 Long by Cos.  
40. 51. 30 West, at Sun set. Sailed Sand  
Lore N.E. 10 miles dist. steering S.E.  
with fine weather, Middle part light winds  
and calm, latter part light winds from  
S.S.W. heading S.E. by the wind employed  
filling the Boats, Lat. by Cos. 40 15 N.

Tuesday September the 15<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from S.W. steering  
S.E. at 1 P.M. Wind changed to N.W.  
in a squall took in Light Sails and  
steered S.E. at 5 P.M. Long by Cos.  
40. 50. West Sailed a Ship steering S.W.  
at 7 P.M. steering East by a squall  
part, strong winds from south under  
double reefed top sails, at 9 P.M. Long

Wednesday September the 16<sup>th</sup>  
All the 24 hours fresh winds and  
squally from S.W. to N.W. by  
Long. 67. 48 W  
Lat. 37. 41 N
