Wednesday Jan. the 31st
Commences fresh trades from
S. N. E. heading S. E. under single
reefs Lat. by act. at 6 P.M. 45.06
Lang. at 6 P.M. by act. 125. 21 W.
at 9 P.M. nearly the island of Brava
at 11.2 P.M. tacked, at 4 A.M. tacked
again, and at 5 A.M. went on
Shore

Thursday Feb. the 1st 1855
Commences strong trades, at 5 P.M.
the Boat came off with potatoes hogs
fowls, Bananas, Oranges Plantain
doggs, and the devil, knives & what
at 8 A.M. she went on shore
again, Middle and Latter parts employ'd
getting off the remainder of our
recruits, 3 of our men are gone
and sick, the other two deserters

Friday Feb. the 2nd 1855
Commences strong trades, at 4
P.M. finish'd recruiting, and
squad'd away steering, steering
S. W. under all sail Middle and
Latter parts, light winds and calms
from N. E. steering S. by W. under
all sail Lat. by obs. 11. 23 N.

Saturday Feb. the 3rd
Commences light winds and calms
from N. E. steering S. by W. Middle and
Latter parts much the same,
Lat. by obs. 13. 24 N.

Master towards the Island of Tustande Acua

Sunday Feb. the 4th
Commences fine weather from N. E. steering
S. by W. under all sail, all hands employ'd
in Ships duty, one Brig in sight
Middle and Latter fresh winds from
N. N. E. steering South under all sail
Lat. by obs. 11. 14 N.

Monday Feb. the 5th
Commences strong trades from
N. N. E. steering South under all
sail, Middle and Latter parts much
the same, Lat. by obs. 11. 54 N.

Tuesday Feb. the 6th
Commences fresh trade and clear
weather, steering South under
all sail, Middle and Latter parts
fresh winds from N. N. E. steering
South under all sail,
Lat. by obs. 5. 06 N.
Lang. by obs. 123. 31 W.

Wednesday Feb. the 7th
Commences fine weather from
N. N. E. steering South, with
every sail spread, to the breeze
Middle part much the same, Latter
winds from S. S. E. heading S. W.
with squalls of wind and
rain. Lat. by obs. 0. 17 N.
