

Remarks on board of ship *Poubeau*  
off the Coast of Madagascar 1833.

Remarks on board Monday 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1833  
first part commences with moderate breezes and  
Clear weather. Steering to the Southward at 3 P.M.  
saw Cape St. Mary on the south part of Madagascar  
bearing by Compass North. the Coast as far as the eye  
could reach appeared to be low and level to the Eastward  
at 3 P.M. tacked off shore Dist from the Cape 15 miles  
Weather part Calm.

Lat by Cr 26-25 Long by Chro 45-16

Remarks on board Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> 1833  
Commences with light air and calms ship  
heading S.E.

Lat by Cr 26-40 Long by Chro 46-00

Remarks on board Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> 1833  
these twenty four hours commences with pleasant  
weather wind from the S.E. steering W.S.W at  
4 P.M. saw black fish seawards the boats but could  
not strike. Middle and Latter part strong breezes  
steering N.E. under short sail. S. End.

Lat by Cr 26-22 S Long by Chro 45-15

Remarks on board Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> 1833  
first part of these twenty four hours strong winds  
from the S.E. Middle and Latter part rainy heading  
to the southward. S. End.

Lat by Cr 37-00 S Long by Chro 44-00

Remarks on board Friday 22<sup>d</sup> 1833  
first part commences with strong breezes and rainy  
Middle and Latter part more moderate made sail  
and stood in for the land. S. End.

Lat by Cr 36-31 S Long by Chro 43-16-15
